MR. COBUS: The claim, your honour, of Shiosaki, Seiroku, which is No. 89 on the Secretary's list. This will become Case No. 322.

SETROKU SHIOSAKI, the Claiment herein, being first duly sworm, testified through the official interpreter as follows:

As far as the chattel claim 10 is concerned, it is submitted that these goods were sold for their fair market value.

- Yes. I am producing to you two documents which Qs purport to be statements by yourself and your wife of all the chattels which you left in the protected area. A: Yes.

- Q: And the Custodian did find four nets which were sold for \$190.00, isn't that right?
