PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

January 14, 1946.

This man, who was evacuated on April 28, 1942, signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 4, 1942. The only asset reported in his declaration was his fishing vessel.

This vessel is described in Vessels Summary, filed behind this summary. The vessel was sold by Denzo TOYODA through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the total sum of \$1,500.00. The Committee's charges were \$20.00, and the sum of \$980.00 was paid by the Committee to D. TOYODA on June 23, 1942. The balance of the purchase price was covered by a mortgage of \$500.00 in favour of Denzo TOYODA. On October 2, 1942, the sum of \$507.73 was received by the Custodian in full settlement of principal and interest on this mortgage. The discharged mortgage, signed by Denzo TOYODA, was sent to Messrs. Swanson & Wilkinson, on November 13, 1942.

Remittances to the amount of \$340.06, made up of \$5.06 paid to the B. C. Security Commission, March 29, 1943, as refund of maintenance, and \$335.00 remitted to Denzo TOYODA, were made from this account, leaving a balance of \$167.67 standing to the credit of this man.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.



Dear Sir:

This is to advise that your account with this office shows a credit balance of \$167.67, at this date.

In your declaration to the Custodian on April 4, 1942, you stated that you were the owner of a fishing vessel. This vessel was sold by you through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the total sum of \$1,500.00. Of this sum \$1,000.00 was paid to the office of the Committee, and after the deduction of \$20.00 to cover the Committee's supervision charges, the sum of \$980.00 was paid to you direct on June 23, 1942. The remainder of the sale price was covered by a mortgage in your favour.

On October 2, 1942, the sum of \$507.73 was paid to the Custodian in full settlement of principal and interest on this mortgage, and this sum was placed to your credit in the Custodian Trust Account. From this money we paid, at your request, the sum of \$5.06 to the British Columbia Security Commission in March, 1943, and remittances to the amount of \$335.00 were made to you at various times, leaving a balance of \$167.67 to your credit.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area and, in order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.


