PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 1314

July 15, 1946.

Re: Mame OHASHI, Reg. No. 11115

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 27, 1942. She was evacuated on June 22, 1942.

In her declaration she reported a quantity of household effects left at M. Ohashi's house at Port Essington. Of these articles, the following are missing: The set of Tofu tools, 75 records, 6 chairs and 2 tons of coal. Some items were shipped. The account of this woman was credited with the sum of \$10.64 from the sale of some of the chattels declared. The account of her husband, File 13468, was credited with the sum of \$69.83 from the sale of some of these chattels. The husband, in his declaration, had reported many of the same items as the wife had declared.

She reported a radio. This radio was turned over to the Custodian by the RCMP and was sold for the net sum of \$24.99, which has been credited to her account and will be released to her when she sends in the receipt given at the time the radio was surrendered.

She reported a \$100.00 Victory Bond in her own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property.

Mrs. Mume OHASHI signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 27, 1942. Her husband, Shokichi OHASHI, signed a declaration on November 9, 1942. Their declarations were similar in some respects, as shown by the chattel schedule.

Among the articles declared were a sewing machine, a carton of kitchenware, a tub of Niso, a tub of sauce, a mattress and other things shipped, according to letter of January 22, 1943, from Mr. H. J. Brown, of Fort Easington.

A quantity of goods was sold and identified as the property of one of the other of these persons. The net amount credited to the account of Mrs. OHASHI from this source was \$10.64. The net amount credited to the account of Mr. Shokichi OHASHI from the sale of chattels was \$69.83.

The following items declared and apparently on hand on January 22, 1943, are unaccounted for: 2 tons of coal (we sold 2 tons, but at time of sale Mr. Brown reported that some had been stolen).

The set of Tofu Tools (bean curd machinery) is not accounted for although it was on hand on January 22, 1943.

The 75 records are not accounted for although these were on hand on January 22, 1943.

The two cupboard cabinets declared may be accounted for by the counter tops that were sold - proceeds credited to File 13468.

The 7 chairs on hand on January 22, 1943 are not accounted for, except for one baby chair sold.

The trunk declared by Mrs. OHASHI was not declared by her husband in his declaration of November 9, 1942. Mrs. OHASHI, on May 19, 1942, requested shipment of a trunk, and according to Mr. Brown's letter of January 22, 1943, some of the goods requested at that time were shipped.

Some small items, identified as the property of Shokichi OHASHI, were sold and the proceeds credited to his account. These items were not declared but may have been packed in some of the articles declared.

The articles which can not be accounted for in any way, but are known to have been on hand in January, 1943, are:


