There are two judgments on file against Isaburo NOZAKI as follows:

One against Isaburo NOZAKI in favour of Tamane AKAZAWA, in the sum of \$2,825.02. This was taken out by Matsushi AKAZAWA on behalf of his sister Tamane in Japan on a power of attorney.

The other judgment is one against NOZAKI in favour of West Coast Shipbuilders Ltd. for \$215.34. Actually this one appears to be against both Isaburo NOZAKI and his son Kanji, File 4548. The only credit Kanji has with the Custodian is \$5.17. The firm of Walsh, Bull, Rousser, Tupper, Ray & Carroll handled this case. We wrote to them on July 3/43 giving them details of both claims and suggesting a division of the money standing to the credit of Isaburo NOZAKI, but we have received no reply to this letter.

Funds standing in this account were distributed pro rata to the creditors of Isaburo NOZAKI. The sum of \$160.86 was transferred to the account of Tamane AKAZAWA, Entry File 1322. The sum of \$13.61 sent to Messrs. Walsh, Bull, et al, was returned to this office by Francis H. Benn Ltd., Insurance Underwriters, and has been sent to Isaburo NOZAKI.

Nazaki and C. I. Nazaki. Their address at the time action was commenced was 775 East Georgia Street, Vancouver, B. C. The Judgment and costs bear interest at 5 per cent per annum from May 27, 1942.

Mr. Bradshaw, the solicitor for the Japanese, advised that his clients had no assets other than a Ford V 8 coach, B. C. License 1941 - 68-062, which car was under seizure by the Mounted Police at Hastings Park.

In view of the discussion between you and my representative, Mr. Lawrence, yesterday relative to this matter I am herewith enclosing the following documents:-


1. Copy of Judgment in the action of Tamame Akazawa versus Isaburo Nozaki.

Thank you for your letter dated May 18th.

Mr. Isaburo Nozaki, whose address is Blind Bay, B. C. and with whom you are entirely at liberty to communicate, denies that he is indebted to you in any way. Mr. Kappelle advises us that Tamame Akazawa secured judgment on September 29, 1925 against Isaburo Nozaki for \$734.65 plus costs of \$454.25 making a total of \$1,188.90 plus 5% interest. Interest computed up to September 29, 1942 amounted to \$1,535.97 making a total outstanding as of that date of \$2,724.87.

The judgment is in favour of Tamame Akazawa a resident of Japan and we are unable to ascertain from your solicitor nor have we found any record of any assignment of the judgment to you. Mr. Kappelle states that he has no knowledge of such an assignment.

In the absence of more complete particulars, we do not see what steps, if any, the Custodian can further take in connection with the matter of your claim against Mr. Isaburo Nozaki, but if there is any action you desire the Custodian to take, kindly provide us with complete particulars together with documentary evidence indicative of your interest in the matter.

When replying to this letter, please detail clearly your relationship to Tamame Akazawa.

Attached are both files in connection with which you sent me your memorandum dated May 28th. I must confess I do not know exactly how the Evacuation Section should proceed in determining the validity or otherwise of the claim filed by Matsushiro AKAZAKI presumably on behalf of his sister, Tamame AKAZAKI, of Japan, against Mr. Isaburo NOZAKI under a Judgment obtained in September or October 1925 in connection with which the Supreme Court on September 6, 1940 ordered that the Plaintiff Judgment Creditor be at liberty to issue a writ of Fieri Facias in aid of execution in said action. Mr. Isaburo NOZAKI denies all knowledge of the Judgment.

I have been unable to obtain any information as to whether the interests of Tamame AKAZAKI were assigned to her brother, Matsushiro AKAZAKI, and, therefore, before having the conference with Mr. Ray of Messrs. Walsh, Bull, Haussner, Tupper, Ray & Carroll, I wonder if you would be good enough to endeavor to secure the necessary information either from Mr. A. J. Kappala, who was Counsel for Tamame AKAZAKI, or from Mr. A. C. Brydon-Jack who was Counsel for Mr. Isaburo NOZAKI, unless the information may in some way be more readily obtained from the Court Records. The hearing was, as you know, before Mr. Justice Gregory.

Further to our memo of June 15th last, we have now received the required information regarding judgement against Isaburo NOZAKI in favour of Tamame AKAZAKA. This document revealed that Matsushi AKAZAKA was acting on behalf of his sister, Tamame AKAZAKA and that the debt owing to her by NOZAKI was not assigned to him. This is confirmed by Mr. A.J. Kappelo's letter of March 18th, 1943, in which he states he knows nothing of any assignment to Matsushi AKAZAKA of the debt.

It would therefore appear that the distribution of the funds amounting to \$174.47 now to the credit of Isaburo NOZAKI should be as follows:


