Over a month before his evacuation this man reported household effects on his JP Declaration. The goods were to be left in Phoenix Cannery house. On December 1, 1942 Custodian sent Mr. IZUMI a list of the articles found at Phoenix Cannery and identified as Mr. IZUMI's property. This list was returned December 5/42, signed by Jinmatsu IZUMI as representing all his chattels. Disposition of the goods on inventory is as follows:

Chattels:

On April 4th, 1942, Jinmatsu IZUMI declared household belongings which, in the event of evacuation, were to be left in the Phoenix Cannery house. These goods were removed from house #46, Phoenix Cannery to storage in warehouse #3, on July 10, 1942. Please see Chattel Schedule.

Many of the articles originally declared in IZUMI's JP declaration are missing or unaccounted for, but as IZUMI was not evacuated until May 20, 1942, it may be presumed that some of these articles were disposed of by the Japanese prior to his evacuation.

The sum of \$38.80 was derived from the sale of his goods at public auction.

Although IZUMI did not declare nets in his JP Form, on Nov. 26, 1943 he sent in a list of his nets and twine left in the care of the manager of Phoenix Cannery in the Net house. Please see Net Summary for position of nets. A total of \$760.21 was derived from the sale of these nets. This amount was credited to IZUMI's account with this office.

Specified Articles:

A boat, the "Sweet Sixteen"/"K.T." was sold to the Canadian Fishing Co. Ltd. on March 26, 1942, for \$1400.00. These funds were paid to J. IZUMI by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee.



Dear Madam:

We are sorry to see from various correspondence on our files with you and with the B.C. Security Commission that you have still not received the Cross Cut Saws applied for in March this year.

Mr. Kimura reported on May 21st that you did receive two (2) Saws, which belonged, however, to Mr. Jinnatsu IZUMI, a close relative of yours. Have you made any arrangements with Jinnatsu IZUMI about these, or should we write to him and find out his wishes?

On June 16th, we shipped three (3) more Cross Cut Saws to you, believing that these were the correct ones, but apparently this was not the case. We are sorry this should have happened, but it would appear to be at least partly your fault for not plainly tagging your property before evacuation.

We suppose you will be able to use the ones you have received and can only suggest that you retain them, as we can locate no others.

We have incurred a total expense of \$2.55 in shipping these Saws to you and trust you will reimburse us with this sum, as originally undertaken by you in your letter of March 5th.

MR. COBUS: The claim of Jinnatsu Izumi, which is No. 21 on the Secretary's list.

JINMATSU IZUMI, the claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the official interpreter as follows:

10 MR. COBUS: This is a claim, your honour, for personal property, largely in the nature of fishing gear, that is, nets, which the claimant has shown on the first page. If your honour would allow the amendment, we are now showing the value of the fishing gear as \$1585.00, as is, but have amended the credit to the Custodian, which should have been \$610.00. The reduction of that credit was made necessary because the claimant was not in fact claiming against certain items, and yet he showed a credit for them. I think we can show wherein the credit should be \$610.00. That leaves a net claim of \$985.00, which is also the total claim in this case.

20

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. COBUS

Q: Witness, I produce to you a statement concerning the nets for which you have submitted a claim in the amount of \$1585.00. Did you instruct Mr. Leckie to prepare that statement for you and is that your signature? A: Yes.

Q: In your statement you make reference to a list of nets. I produce to you a list of nets totalling, under estimated value, \$1585.00. Is that the

30

list to which your statement makes reference?

A: Yes.

Q: Is the information contained in your statement and in the list attached to it true to the best of your knowledge and recollection?

A: Yes.

THE COMMISSIONER: That will be Exhibit 1.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1)

10 MR. COBUS: In his statement marked Exhibit 1, the witness says that all of the nets for which he is claiming had cork and lead lines, and the Custodian's Analysis shows a split of values as between the nets and lines in each instance. the lines in each case were the same fathoms in length as the nets. He says that the nets and lines were left in the net house of the Phoenix Cannery at Steveston, British Columbia, and they were all tagged with his name on the tags. He says that he has allowed for depreciation on
20 all the nets claimed.

Would my learned friend produce the Analysis of Personal Property Claim?

(Handed to Mr. Cobus)

MR. COBUS: The Analysis is filed on behalf of the Crown.

THE COMMISSIONER: That will be Exhibit 2.

(Analysis marked Exhibit No. 2)

30 MR. COBUS: Referring to Exhibit 2, your honour, by eliminating the items under the heading "Goods not subject of claim" in the third column headed

"Details of Claim", the lead line item and certain furniture, chinaware and miscellaneous items, the credit, in fact, will add to \$610.00. In fact, by taking the first eight sales under "Tender" as listed against certain of the nets, it will be seen that item 9, a sockeye net, is admitted by the Custodian as "No account, theft," and item 10 is shown as having been declared but not found.

10

Your witness.

MR. MACDONALD: I submit, your honour that the personal property in this case was sold at its fair market value and that the claim for the personalty is at an exorbitant value.

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. MACDONALD:

Q: Witness, you were evacuated on May 20, 1942?

A: Yes.

Q: And you didn't give a list of these nets and lines for which you are claiming to the Custodian until November 28, 1943, is that right?

A: No, I didn't report until then.

Q: Now, you have no experience in selling second hand nets and lines, have you?

A: Yes, I do.

Q: You have sold them? A: Yes, I have experience.

Q: In selling or buying?

A: In selling.

30 Q: Is it not a fact that when you are selling

second hand goods, nets or materials, goods and chattels of any kind, that you do not get a very high price for them?

A: Yes, I know that.

MR. MACDONALD: That is all, your honour.

MR. COBUS: With respect to my friend's question with regard to the declaration of the nets, your honour, I can only refer to what is fairly obvious on the Custodian's own Analysis. Eight nets were sold, a ninth is declared "No account theft", and the tenth is said to have been declared but not found. The list which is part of Exhibit 1 is for ten nets and ten nets only.

No questions.

THE COMMISSIONER: Is there anything further?

MR. MACDONALD: Just in regard to the one that was declared and not found, which might easily be the case when there was such a lapse of time between the time when the information was given to the Custodian.
