This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on March 2/42 and was evacuated on April 18/42, declared chattels as noted on the J.P. form, left at the house of Mrs. Yone KARIYA. We wrote to the above on March 16/43 stating that we found no trace of his goods in the house of Mrs. KARIYA. He replied on March 26/45 advising that he had moved his goods to the Mio Sonjin Kai, 3rd and Moncton St., Steveston. All the chattels from this address were inventoried in the name of Mrs. C. HAMAGUCHI by Custodian agent, C.C. Robinson, on Oct. 16/42, as per list No. 71 on the file of Mrs. HAMAGUCHI, 4493, and moved to central storage. All the goods from this list that could be identified as belonging to the above were sold at auction for the net sum of \$50.82, and this sum credited to the account of the above with this office. On June 8/45 the account of the above was credited with the sum of \$5.00, being proceeds from sale of a heater sold to the B.C. Packers Ltd. The motor and accessories, big pot, bean grinder, bicycle, and 3 fish nets declared by the above were not found by the Custodian and may have been disposed of or taken by TAKENO at the time of his evacuation. Certain items which we credited to him are being transferred to Chattel Suspense Account as we cannot positively identify them as belonging to the above.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES. According to information supplied to this office the above declared a radio stored at J. W. Kelly Piano Co. Ltd., Vancouver. Particulars of this are given in a summary on file dated Dec. 20/44.

MONEYS RECEIVABLE: On Feb. 27/46 the account of the above was credited with the sum of \$3.00, being a refund of security deposit for light from the B.C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

Enclosed please find Custodian cheque in the sum of \$58.82. As this is your total balance with this office we are now closing your file.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you made your declaration to the Custodian on March 2nd, 1945, you declared chattels left at the house of Mrs. Kariya, Steveston. In reply to our letter advising you that we could not find your goods at this house you replied stating that you had removed your goods to the Mio Sanjin Kai, 3rd Ave. and Moncton Street, Steveston. All the goods from this house that could be identified as belonging to you have been sold for the net sum of \$55.82 and this sum credited to your account with the Custodian.

On February 27th, 1946, your account was credited with the sum of \$3.00, being a refund of security deposit for light from the B. C. Electric Railway Company Ltd.

We note that the J. W. Kelly Piano Company Ltd. are holding a radio for you. This we presume is the R. C. A. Victor radio which you declared to the Custodian.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
