In December, 1942, Mr. Ormand wrote that he was considering leasing the building at a restal of \$4.00 per month. He stated that the ground rent was \$3.00 per month and that there were arrears of \$30.00. In January, 1943, Mr. Ormand informed us that a brick chimney, which was necessary before the building could be leased, would not be installed as it was found insavisable.

In August, 1942, Mr. Orwand had informed Mr. E. W. Forward that he was willing to allow the removal of the building but that if it were not removed in the near future, he would tear it down as it was a fire member to die Giller building.

There is no evidence that TANING had a written lease on the ground, the ground rentals were in arrears, the cost of removing the building would in all probability have been more than the building was worth. For all these reasons no further action was taken by this office in regard to this building.

He is quite willing to allow the removal of the building, but unless this is done in the near future he intends to tear it down, as he considers it a fine menace to his other buildings. The proposition of removing the building, is in my opinion out of the question, as there is no land available to place it, even if the value of the building justified ! its removal, which I do not think it does. 
