REAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Mansuke TANINO #07908

This man, in his declaration to the Custodian, reported a one-story five room house on property belonging to Howard Ormond, Nanaimo. On this he paid a rental of \$4.00 per year, and his lease expired in December, 1942.

This building, according to Mr. E. W. Forward's report of June 29, 1942, was in a fair state of repair and had a selling value of approximately \$250.00, but the fact that it was on leased property and the fact that the lease was due to expire in December made its value questionable.

The building was situated at Ormond's Wharf (formerly Koyama's Wharf) Brechin, Nanaimo. It was according to memorandum of April 10, 1945, built on piling below high tide level.

In December, 1942, Mr. Ormond wrote that he was considering leasing the building at a rental of \$4.00 per month. He stated that the ground rent was \$3.00 per month and that there were arrears of \$30.00. In January, 1943, Mr. Ormond informed us that a brick chimney, which was necessary before the building could be leased, would not be installed as it was found inadvisable.

In August, 1942, Mr. Ormond had informed Mr. E. W. Forward that he was willing to allow the removal of the building but that if it were not removed in the near future, he would tear it down as it was a fire menace to his other buildings.

There is no evidence that TANINO had a written lease on the ground, the ground rentals were in arrears, the cost of removing the building would in all probability have been more than the building was worth. For all these reasons no further action was taken by this office in regard to this building.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Mansuke TANINO, Reg. No. 07908

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 20, 1942. He was evacuated on September 19, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a quantity of chattels left in his former residence at Nanaimo, B. C. The articles reported have been accounted for by sale, with the exception of the following items: 3 mattresses, which were not inventoried by Custodian representative, and would appear to have been removed from the building prior to the date on which the goods were inventoried; one chair, which apparently was found in the house, but does not appear to have been sold; a box of dishes - two boxes and a quantity of other items (not declared) were removed from this man's house - TANINO declared only the box of dishes, but 12 containers of various kinds appear on the inventory, while 13 containers (not similar to those inventoried) were shipped to him on November 24, 1942. Although a gramophone was not declared, one was inventoried and one gramophone and 40 records were shipped to him on October 5, 1943. As is common with Nanaimo files, it has been impossible to reconcile declaration, inventory, shipments and sales appearing in this file. The sum of \$18.90 has been credited to this account as net proceeds from the sale of chattels.

TANINO also reported a sewing machine, 4 beds, a trunk, a dressing table and a rowboat left in the care of a white fisherman, whose name and address he did not know. Nothing further appears in file regarding these.

TANINO reported a Monarch Life Insurance Policy, #P100528; on February 6, 1946, we returned to the Monarch Life their cheque for \$60.39, being cash surrender value of this policy, and asked the company to forward it direct to Mr. & Mrs. Mansuke TANINO, as the discharge form required signing.

TANINO signed a Statutory Declaration stating that he had surrendered the vessel "M.T." to Naval Service. A vessel "M.T." owned by M. TANINO was among the vessels impounded, and as this vessel was not sold or otherwise disposed of, it was assumed that this vessel must have sank at the moorings just after being impounded, as a number of vessels did, and that this vessel was not located by divers when the other sunken boats were located and raised. Therefore, on the basis of age and dimensions, a value of \$200.00 was placed on this vessel, and claim for this sum was approved by Naval Service. The sum of \$195.50 (\$200.00 less charges of \$4.50) was credited to TANINO's account but this money is frozen until TANINO signs a Release accepting this sum.

The sum of \$10.35 was credited to this account in full settlement of the claim lodged with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred at the impounding of the vessel "M.T."

This file reveals no other personal property.



I have been trying for some time to contact Mr. Ormond in connection with house claimed by above party, but only today have been able to interview him.

Mr. Ormond states that the house claimed by Tanino, is located on the property which he purchased from F. Koyama. He claims however that there was no registered lease between Tanino and Koyama.

He is quite willing to allow the removal of the building, but unless this is done in the near future he intends to tear it down, as he considers it a fine menace to his other buildings.

The proposition of removing the building, is in my opinion out of the question, as there is no land available to place it, even if the value of the building justified its removal, which I do not think it does.

It might be advisable for you to write Mr. Ormond direct on this matter, in order that you have his decision in a more concrete form for your files.
