This 55-year old Naturalised-Canadian Fisherman from Prince Rupert, signed a Custodian "JP" form on the 24th March, 1942. He was evacuated on the 14th May, 1942.

His wife, Masuye, File 7030, signed a Gustodian "JP" form on the 30th April, 1942. She was evacuated on the 14th May, 1942.

The above is the registered owner of Block 29, District Lots 529, 927, 4415 and part of 926. Flam 1092, Goast District, consisting of 10.7 acres more or less. It is situated at Osland, a settlement on an island at the mouth of the Skeena River.

The Frevincial Collector informs us that taxes are owing on the property for the years 1938, 1939, 1940, 1941 and 1942, and would have reverted at this year's tax sale, except for the fact that no tax sale was held.

Since the property is too far from here for us to visit we asked the Provincial Police to investigate for us on one of their routine trips. We quote from their letter as follows:

You were on the 20th instant served with Garnishee Summons on the Judgment recovered by Rinkichi Tagashira against Nakatani ; in the Summons the Garnishee is described as Frank G. Shears, Director, Custodian of Enemy Property. This was, no doubt, served with the intention of attaching monies payable to this Defendant under the award by Mr. Justice Bird. In my opinion the Garnishee does not attach such funds; the Garnishee Summons will attach only debts due or accruing due to the Defendant; the report of Mr. Justice Bird does not create a debt from the Department in favour of this Defendant. Under P.C. 1810 of July 18th 1947, Mr. Justice Bird by Clause 1 directed "to enquire into the following claims" and under Clause 2 "to make a report The report therefore of Mr. to the Governor-in-Council." Justice Bird is merely a recommendation which may or may not be adopted, and it creates no obligation of debt in favour of this Defendant, to whom payment has been recommended.

In the Garnishee Summons Mr. Shears is named as the Garnishee , there are certainly no monies owing by Mr. Shears. Any monies payable are by the appropriate Federal Department. In any event, assuming there were debts owing from the Federal Government to this Defendant , they would not be attached under a Provincial process. There is no doubt that this is an attempt under a Provincial process to make a charge on the public funds, but because of the constitutional limitations of the Province such process could not be effective. At the same time it is directed against Mr. Shears personally and therefore cannot be ignored, otherwise a judgment might be entered against Mr. Shears. Two steps are open to the Garnishee :-

> 1. To move to set aside the Garnishee, but that would involve an application to the court, and costs.
