Mr. Collier has asked us to send you applications for Cash Surrender Value in connection with the first two policies. These are enclosed and the one for the first policy is to be signed by Mrs. Tsuyu Yasui as "Assured" and her husband, Ukiyoshi YASUI, as Beneficiary. The one in connection with the second policy will be signed by Mr. Yasui as "assured" and by Mrs. Yasui as "Beneficiary". We calculate the cash surrender value of the first policy to be about \$365.00 and the second one about \$740.00. The policy contracts will of course be required.

Mr. Collier asked that we send you forms to provide for Extended term under Policy No. 2,225,967. The Extended Term privilege is not available while there is any indebtedness against the policy and if Mr. Yasui will pay off the current automatic premium loan debt before the next premium falls due in November 1943 he could at that time apply to have the policy endorsed as Extended Term Assurance for a period of thirteen years which would mean until November 20th. 1956 and then provided the Assured is still alive on that date a Pure Endowment of \$212.00 would be payable. Should the Assured wish to pay off the automatic premium loan at the present time the amount required is \$48.40.
