

This 50-year old Naturalized-Canadian Fisherman from Prince Rupert, B. C., signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 24th March, 1942. He was evacuated on the 4th May, 1942.

His wife, Misao, File 720, signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 26th March, 1942. She was evacuated on the 30th May, 1942.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None. See "Personal Property" below for Messuage Tenure interest in Boat Building Shed on Cannery property.

Personal Property: See our letter of Aug. 13/43, and Cannery's reply of Aug. 30/43, for particulars of a Boat Building Shed built by Evacuee on North Pacific Cannery property - which Cannery Company stated cost approximately \$200.00, but which they estimated would barely compensate for cost of labour involved if dismantled.

See Chattels Schedule, dated 28th September, 1948, for particulars of chattels disclosed in file.

Specified Articles: See Fishing Vessel Summary, dated Mar. 30/44, for particulars of F.V. "K.K. III", sold Mar. 27/42, through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for \$300.00, net proceeds (\$294.50) being paid direct to owner (Apr. 10/42).

A Phonola mantel Radio, turned in by this Evacuee to the R.C.M.P. was eventually sold (Mar. 24/44) by this office at auction for \$9.75, net proceeds (\$8.46) being credited to this account. Naval receipt, dated Feb. 10/42, is on file.

Bills Receivable: The sum of \$50.25 was received from Canadian Government, and credited to this account (Apr. 11/45), in reimbursement of transportation expenses connected with delivery of F.V. "K.K. III".

Bonds, Shares, etc.: A \$50.00 Victory Bond and \$50.00 War Savings Certificates, declared to be in owner's possession, did not come under the administration of this office.

The boatshop referred to was brought down from our British America Cannery at Port Essington when we closed that cannery and was re-erected here by Kadowaki to enable him to build gill-net boats for us during the winter. The agreement between himself and the cannery was merely verbal. He was to be allowed to tear the building down and remove it if he desired. It was not to be occupied by other parties without our consent.



The building is of no value to us and we would not be interested in taking it over. We have far too many buildings belonging to the cannery which were previously occupied by Japanese.

The building in question is just an open boat-shed with one small lean-to room attached. The material recoverable when it is torn down would barely compensate for the labor involved.

The taxes you mention appear to us excessive for a building costing at the time it was built approximately \$200.00 and no land involved. Is it legal for the province to collect taxes on a building in this manner. The cannery pays enough taxes to cover all these rundown shacks. // says

We would take the opportunity to request that no effort be made to rent this shed to outsiders as we expect to tear the building down next spring and have had a little difficulty already with tenants and squatters in abandoned buildings on the outskirts of the cannery property.




