



In connection with the property at 886 East Cordova Street which is owned by one Kikue Kawakami now evacuated these premises are now occupied by his wife, Sakae, No. 02936, and her six children, ages five to fifteen and Kenichiro Kawakami, No. 01808.

Kikue's father declared this property to us on behalf of his son and later authorised a sale to the Baker Forge Company for \$1,000.00. We have sent the deed to Jasper for Kikue's signature but the foreman of the Camp has wired us that he has moved away and at the moment we have not his new address.

The above transaction has been held up for a considerable time and the property is urgently required for expansion purposes by the Baker Forge Company who are engaged in vital war work.

Yesterday we had a call from Mr. Blundell of the Department of Munitions stating that the Baker Forge Company were falling behind on deliveries owing to lack of space.

If the Japanese living on the premises were removed to Hastings Park in the very near future, we could authorise the Baker Forge Company to take over the land, expand their equipment and in so doing satisfy the demand of the Department of Munitions.

Naturally, however, we ourselves have no control over the question of the movement of these or any other
