This man declared a debt owing to J. H. Todd & Sons, Inverness Cannery, of \$230.00. This claim was settled by the taking over by Inverness Cannery of fishing gear and wood to the value of \$230.00, as shown in letter dated April 20, 1942.

Copy of letter, received in this office on March 13, 1943, refers to "My balance T. Nakagawa - \$155.00" J. H. Todd & Sons report that this is a balance due Ono from T. Nakagawa from whom Ono had purchased a boat. Ono, however, had shown this as a debit balance, and it would possibly be a balance due from Ono to the former owner of the boat. However, as no T. Nakagawa has filed a claim against Ono, and Ono has not shown monies due him from Nakagawa, we must assume that this indebtedness has been settled to the satisfaction of the parties concerned.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Juhei ONO, Reg. No. 11050

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942. He was evacuated from the protected area on July 25, 1942, but had been moved from Inverness Cannery, Skeena River, B. C. early in March, 1942.

Goods left at Inverness Cannery by persons employed by the cannery or by fishermen attached to the cannery were left in the care of the cannery. Shipments were made by the cannery people at the request of the Japanese. Reports of shipments made were not supplied to the Custodian by Inverness Cannery. Making the shipments entailed quite a lot of work on the part of the cannery without the added burden of supplying this office with details of the shipments. Prior to the opening of the cannery in the summer of 1942, the company reported that the space occupied by Japanese chattels was required and goods remaining on hand were shipped to Prince Rupert in June, 1942. Mr. Dave Smith, of this office, visited Inverness in April, 1942, and inventoried the goods of Japanese stored there. His inventory is attached to the J.P. form, and is unsigned and undated.

Chattels: ONO reported fishing gear, household effects, clothing and foodstuffs left at the warehouse Inverness Cannery. Some of these were sold by ONO direct to J.H. Todd & Sons as shown by the statement dated May 29, 1942, which is attached to B.C. Security Commission letter of March 13, 1943. Goods requested in Custodian Release of May 19, 1942, appear to have been shipped by the cannery. Goods, of sufficient value to warrant shipping to Prince Rupert, which remained on hand were shipped to Prince Rupert on June 19, 1942, and saleable items were sold on August 3, 1944, for the net sum of \$36.52, which was credited to the account of Juhei ONO.

Boat-house: Juhei ONO reported a house valued at \$50.00 built on the property of Inverness Cannery. On April 30, 1942, the cannery company, J. H. Todd & Sons stated that no permission had been given for the building of the house, and that the company had no use for the boat shed. As sale to any one other than the cannery would have been difficult, and the cannery was not interested, no further action was taken by this office.

Radio: The radio surrendered by Juhei ONO was sold at auction for the net sum of \$25.36, which was credited to his account.

Camera: The camera, shown in the Specified Articles Summary, was not declared and has been established to have been the property of his son Shigenobu ONO, File 1276, by whom it was disposed of to Mr. Taylor, 427 Powell Street, Vancouver. The camera was released to Mr. Taylor.

Vessel: The fishing vessel "Asahi" was sold by ONO through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, and the net proceeds of this sale, \$294.50, were paid direct to ONO by the Committee.

Accounts J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd. - \$300.00, purchase price of vessel. This was paid Receivable: to the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee by whom it was paid out to Juhei ONO as reported in vessel summary.

The sum of \$5.00 in full settlement of claim filed by ONO with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred by him in connection with the impounding of his vessel was received by the Custodian from the Dominion Government and was credited to the account of ONO.

CHATELS SUMMARY

Re: Jubei ONO #11050

This man, who was evacuated from the protected area on July 25, 1942, signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942. This declaration, apparently, was signed shortly after his arrival at Hastings Park from his home at Inverness Cannery, Skeena River, B.C.

In his declaration he reported a number of items as shown in the first column of the Chatels Schedule. All goods were at Inverness Cannery, he stated.

He reported two nets, but J. H. Todd & Sons reported on April 20, 1943, that they had purchased for the total sum of \$230.00, the items shown in the third column of the Chattel Schedule. Copy of letter, dated May 29, 1942, which is filed under date of March 15, 1943, from Mr. Ono to Mr. Sinclair, of Inverness Cannery, indicates that other fishing gear was left at Inverness Cannery. The file reveals nothing further about this fishing gear, and it would appear that Ono and Inverness Cannery reached a mutually satisfactory agreement in regard to Mr. Ono's gear and his indebtedness to the cannery. No fishing gear is shown in the inventory taken by Mr. Dave Smith, of this office, on his visit to Inverness in the early spring of 1942.

While the inventory taken by Mr. Smith does not agree very well with the list of chattels declared by Ono, a comparison of the items declared, the inventory and the goods listed on the Custodian Release of May 19, 1942, shows a fair measure of agreement.

The Custodian Release of May 19, 1942, is the only indication on file to show that any shipment was made to this man, but as he has made no further inquiries in regard to his effects, it is assumed that shipment was made as requested.

On June 19, 1942, George Rorie & Co., Custodian agents, reported that one ironing board, 6 boxes and one carton of household effects belonging to this man were shipped to Prince Rupert from Inverness. It would appear that this shipment covered all articles belonging to Ono then at the cannery and of sufficient value to warrant the expense of shipment to Prince Rupert. The cannery would at that time be clearing out all Japanese goods in preparation for the opening of the cannery. The ironing board and the contents of the boxes would seem to be accounted for in the auction at Prince Rupert on August 3, 1944, when goods identified as the property of this man were sold for the net sum of \$36.52, which was credited to his account.

We have Mr. M. Sullivan's letter of February 27th with reference to Mr. Ono's transactions with Mr. Sinclair, and enclose copy of a letter which Mr. Ono wrote to Mr. Sinclair from Hastings Park on May 29th last. Apparently since Ono wrote this letter to Mr. Sinclair, he has been notified by the Inverness fishermen that Mr. Sinclair would buy the nets for \$50.00 and \$25.00, not \$75.00 and \$50.00 as stated to Mr. Sinclair. This would therefore leave a credit balance of \$89.50 instead of \$139.50 as stated. This appears to be the only correspondence that Mr. Ono has in this matter.

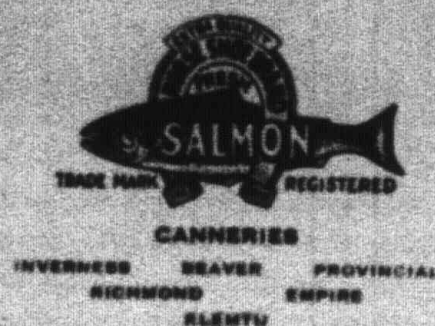

Dear Sirs,,

Yours of the 22nd ultimo was handed to writer on his arrival here recently - he having been in the south for some time.

One's account as prepared by himself, is not quite correct. The item "my balance T.Nakagawa...\$155.00" has nothing to do with our company but represents an amount owing to him by this man T.Nakagawa from whom Ono took over the gasboat "Asahi", which our firm purchased through the Jap.Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee a year ago for \$300.00

Ono's account on our books was \$230.00 and to square this amount off; we took over two pohoe nets and one spring net \$90.00 - one net gurdy at 45.50 and 15 $\frac{3}{4}$ cords wood for 94.50 which totals \$230.00

As requested by you, we enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the amount of \$66.88, representing all funds standing to your credit with this office.

In your declaration to the Custodian, on March 24, 1942, you reported a quantity of fishing gear, chattels and foodstuffs left at Inverness Cannery warehouse. According to information supplied to this office, fishing gear and other chattels to the value of \$230.00 were taken over by the cannery in settlement of a claim against you, while other chattels were shipped to you. All saleable chattels remaining at Inverness Cannery were removed to Prince Rupert in June, 1942, and those identified as your property were sold for the net sum of \$36.52, which was credited to your account.

Your radio was sold for the net sum of \$25.36, as you have been advised, and this sum was credited to your account.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that the vessel "ASAHI" was sold by you in March, 1942, through the Committee, and that the proceeds of this sale, in the amount of \$294.50, were paid to you in April, 1942. The claim for \$300.00 which you filed against J. H. Todd & Sons was in connection with the sale of this vessel, and was settled by the payment of that sum to the Committee.

The sum of \$5.00 was received from the Dominion Government, as you were advised, in settlement of your claim for refund of expenses incurred at the time your vessel was impounded.

The War Savings Certificate and Bank Account, which you declared, did not come under the control of this office.

You reported that M. Nishimura owed you \$65.00 and that S. Nishimura owed you \$120.00. As these are very common names, we have been unable to identify the persons to whom you referred, and settlement of these claims has not been made through this office. It is probable that you have succeeded in collecting these moneys from the persons concerned.


