CHattel SUMMARY

In his declaration of April 4, 1942, TABUCHI declared that he was the owner of a house situated on the property owned by the Atagi's being Lot "B" of 3 acre portion of section 4, Block 3 North, Range 7 West, Map 3756, Municipality of Richmond in the District of New Westminster.

Mr. Mather, Custodian's agent, reports on April 22, 1942,

"This is a 3 room frame shack, water piped into the house. Outside toilet, no bathroom and no fire insurance carried. I do not consider this house could be rented and would recommend that it be boarded up for the duration."

Mr. Thomas C. King, Custodian's agent, rented this property in July 1942 to Charles H. Gustasson at \$8.00 per month plus \$2.00 for water. Gustasson vacated this property in September 30, 1942.

Mr. C. Burns then became the tenant and remained in possession until February, 1943.

Mr. P.O. Lunden then rented this property and remained in possession until the end of April 1943.

Possession was then taken by Mrs. Yates in June 1943 and rent was paid until the end of August.

J. B. Krahn was given possession on April 2, 1944.

It was then rented to the David Boat Works and rents were received to October 2, 1944.

When the Real Property of the Atagi's was sold, an appraisal was made in the amount of \$50.00 on the shack belonging to TABUCHI. In agreement with the Atagi's, this amount was credited to TABUCHI's account. Rents collected were credited to TABUCHI's account and such charges as ground rent and water were paid by the Custodian, from his account.

The file reveals chattels which were declared by TABUCHI were never removed from his house and there is no record on file that Mr. Robinson, Custodian's agent, ever made an inventory or had the tenants sign for what was left in their possession. On November 4, 1943, this office forwarded to Mr. Robinson a list of chattels which were declared by TABUCHI and requested him to check these chattels. No reply was received from Mr. Robinson until December 1, 1943. In a telephone message to this office, we were informed that Mrs. Yates, the tenant, vacated the premises without notice. At that time, Mr. Robinson was requested to remove the chattels and re-rent the premises.

On January 14, 1944, Mr. Robinson directed a memorandum to this office stating one iron bed -- spring and sides, 5 chairs and one round table were the only chattels he obtained from this house after Mrs. Yates had moved out. In a memorandum of Mr. Robinson's, ~~the~~ found in his file at Steveston dated December 1, 1943.

the chattels removed did not belong to TABUCHI but were loaned by Mr. Robinson to the tenant, Mr. Lunden. No explanation can be made to what happened to the chattels declared, and inventoried, belonging to TABUCHI.

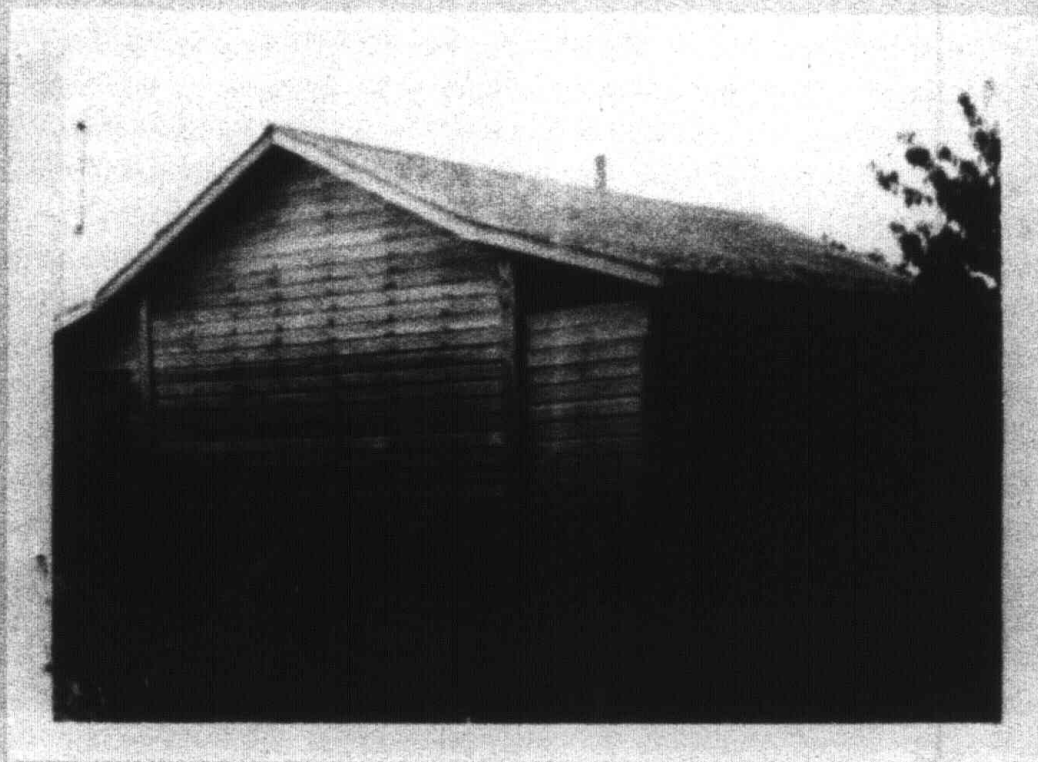



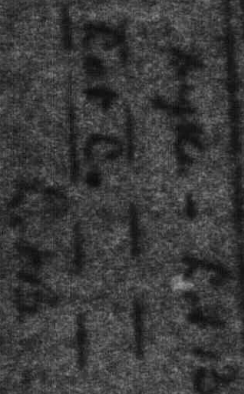

It will be seen that all the buildings belonging to the Atagis, with the exceptions of Nos. 2 (ownership of which is doubtful to them) and Nos. 7, 8, 9 & 10 which are covered by the first four files above mentioned. Also, building No. 14 appears to be owned by B. C. Bridson, who is acting as caretaker for the Atagis.

Does building No. 2 still stand as shown? The Atagis could not identify it, but it is shown on a map which we received from the Municipality.

There was a great deal of pilfering and ransacking going on all over Steveston at that time. It was so bad in fact that we engaged a special constable to aid the Steveston police in trying to check it.

When the Custodian removed your goods to storage for safe-keeping all he found was what we mentioned in our letter of January 18th. We are sorry that under the circumstances there is nothing further we can do.

**APPRAISAL**

Net Lot B of a 9 acre part of Section 4, R31/70, Map 3756, Steveston  
Townsite

Dear Sirs

This property is situated at the extreme East end of Chatham Street and the buildings are either on the dyke or outside of it. There are six shacks and a dwelling and a boat building establishment. The house is built over the inside dyke ditch and on a portion of the dyke itself and is on a post foundation which is not in good condition. It is finished on the inside with "v" joint and the upper portion of each room is papered. The fir floors are sagging and uneven due to poor condition of the foundation. It is poorly laid out and there is no plumbing other than a kitchen sink. The exterior is done in siding badly in need of paint. The roof leaks and the building is probably 40-50 years old. The floor space is 28' x 26'. There is city light and water. There is an outside toilet. Stoves provide the only heat. The large boat building shed is in exceptionally poor shape. The floor joists and the foundation are entirely gone. It may collapse at any time. It is unpainted and weather beaten.

The six shacks all have lean-to structures attached to them at different points probably used as Japanese baths. They are all built on posts over the dyke ditch into which is discharged all the sewerage causing an objectionable odour. They are cheaply built and unpainted. The three acres of land are divided into two parts by Lot "C" which is a board walk running through its entire length and they lie outside the dyke and are in a wild state being subject to flood during freshet season.
