On September 28th Mr. Alexander advised this man that the Gustodian could accept no responsibility for items not declared at the time of registration. This Japanese' W1fe had already on July 23rd signed a list as correct. A further explanatory letter was sent on November 30th.

One wood water tank was shipped on November 19th.

On December 5th this Japanese complained that he received a wood instead of a metal water tank of which he had two, the gas stove was broken and not the new gas stove left behind, and that freight on these items cost \$2.50. He further reported fishing equipment originally left with Tom Liston subsequently taken to the Japanese School at Nanaimo. Nr. Japanese has been saked to check on this December 16th, but it appears that at least the anchors, two water tanks, and whener rope were included in the list of things taken by Lieutenant Armstrong as per list of July 23rd.

The balance of this man's belongings may await final check of the Japanese School at Nanaimo.
