This man, who was evecuated on March 19,1942, signed a declaration to the Custodian on the day of his evacuation. Mr. Morishita had been the proprietor of a store at Spring Cove, Veluelet. He occupied a building of 6 rooms, consisting of store and living quarters.

In his declaration, he reported a stove and an old boat engine. His file does not make it clear whether the stove was shipped to Morishita in one of the quite large shipments of undeclared personal effects sent to him on March 17,1942 and January 29,1943, or left in the premises formerly occupied by him. It is not on the inventory of equipment sold to the Mootka-Banfield Co. Ltd. with the store stock. The boat engine was ed to the Red Cross scrap iron drive on February 8,1943, with the permission of Mr. Morishita.

In his declaration, Mr. Morishita reported that monies were owing to him as follows:

Mootka-Benfield Co. Ltd. from sale of stock, \$3,000.00 Edgard Lipsett & Sons, for sale of goods, \$800.00.

The Mootka-Benfield Co. Ltd. had agreed with Mr. Morishita to take over his merchandise and fixtures, a complete inventory was to be made later by the company, and the goods were to be accepted at the company's valuation. The agreement is dated March 6,1942. The Nootka-Banfield Co. Ltd. offered \$1,3500.00 for the stock and fixtures. This offer was wired to Mr. Morishita by the Custodian, April 24,1942. He replied that he would not accept less than \$2,000.00. However, on April 28,1942, the Nootka-Banfield Co.Ltd. informed the Custodian that they needed the building in which the goods were stored and that on May 1st the goods would be moved and some placed out of doors. In the circumstant the Custodian accepted the offer of \$1,350.00 for the stock and fixtures. Cheque for \$1,350.00 was received Jume 3,1942, and credited to the account of Umeso Morishita. Later Mr. Morishita stated that the adding machine, cash register and other equipment were not included in his agreement with the company, but had been given to the manager of the company for safe-keeping. The Nootka-Banfield Co.Ltd. maintained that all fixture and equipment were included in the purchase and, as there was no documentary evidence to show that this was not the case, the matter was dropped by the Custodian.

The matter of the \$800.00 due from Edward Lipsett & Sons does not appear to have received attention from this office, and Mr. Morishita has not inquired about this. See Telefile

Mr. Morishita declared a Victory Bond of \$100.00 and two \$10.00 War Savings Certificates in the care of his wife. These were not brought under the control of the Custodie

He declared a Sum Life Assurance policy, which was not brought under Custodian contro

The two cameras surrendered to the RCMP are at 604 B.Cordova storage. Shifted Talvid

Marshall Wells B. C. Ltd. paid the Custodian \$71.89 to cover a credit balance belonging to Mr. Morishita.

This file reveals no other property. Although the RCMP report Morishite as a boatowner, we have no record of a vessel owned by him.



However, in view of Mr. Morishita's rejection, and due to the fact that this merchandise is stored in our cannery blocking the work that we have to do, we must ask that people in charge make immediate arrangements to remove this merchandise from our premises. We assume no responsibility of any nature for this merchandise, whether loss or deterioration by weather, rats, or any other cause, or loss by theft. We have to get our cannery crews working in the buildings not later than the 1st of May, and consequently we will be forced to move this merchandise, which we understand is loosely packed in boxes, somewhere else. Some of it may have to be placed out of doors, which would be very unfortunate, as damage could not help but result. We, however, have done everything we can in this matter, and we assume no further interest or responsibility in it, except to advise you of the situation and request for immediate arrangements to be made to get it away from our property. We will do whatever we can to co-operate, of course, but we have to be guided by our own necessities. The following statement was made in the Custodian's Office on May 19th, 1942, by Mrs. Toyo Morishita, her son Tadashi Morishita and her son-in-law Yonekaza Yoshida:

In connection with the sale of property at Ucluelet to the Nootka-Banfield Packing Company Limited, this statement is to record that it was our understanding that an adding machine, cash register, show case and office desk were delivered to Mr. Joe Lyses, manager of the Nootka-Banfield Packing Company Limited for safe keeping and did not form a part of the sale made in connection with the contents of the store. At the same time Mr. Lyses undertook to take charge of other personal effects. We did not receive any receipt regarding this question of safe custody but only had his verbal assurance for same.

It is certainly our hope that the above things mentioned are not included in the sale price of \$1,350.00.

Morishita, Umezo - owner of store stock, to the value of \$2000. This stock turned completely over to the Nootka-Banfield Store, Unlumber. In inventory taken by Morishita and Nootka-Banfield Store and unstructions from the Custodian Japanese Property, through its General Hanager, Mr. Rosenberg, Vancouver, Mead Office.

At Spring Cove also one house of the value of \$1500. Situated on the property of a Miss E. O. Kennedy (G. H. Smith, Victoria, her Agent). This house owned by the Ucluelet Fishing Co. and the land leased until 1945. Remaid Matterson, agent, is renting this house for 24 dollars a month and will arrange as to payment of lease monies.

One house and furnishings to the value of \$500, situated on the property of W. W. Saggars, Spring, and owned by Toshiro Shimizu, with the arrangement that is he moved from this house the property would belong to Saggars. I understand that during the past 15 odd years Shimizu, who built the house, has paid Saggars \$750. for the land rental. Saggars, when Shimizu was evacuated, gave a cheque for \$250, for house and furnishings complete.



We refer to your letter of the 9th April.

This matter has been the subject of considerable correspondence, but at the risk of repeating ourselves we should like again to call your attention to the following facts:

The basic arrangement for the sale of the property is contained in the letter of the 6th March, 1942, which, as you state, was signed by Mr. Lysnes representing Nootka-Banfield Company Limited, and the Japanese. This letter expressly states that the Nootka-Banfield Company Limited will take over Morishita's store me rehandise and fixtures. We may add that the Nootka-Banfield Company Limited made this arrangement at the specific request of the Police Officer at Ucluelet in order to assist in a difficult situation and the Company was not particularly interested in being invoked in the matter at all.

After some correspondence a skeleton bill of sale was prepared by us and forwarded to you for execution. At that time we had not seen the inventory and, as we were informed that it was in your possession, we asked that you have it attached, initialled and returned to us with the executed bill of sale. The bill of sale was returned with a letter from Mr. McPherson on the 21st May, 1942, and in this letter Mr. McPherson pointed out that he could not find that these fixtures were included in the inventory and he asked that we have our clients either verify or dispute the statements made by the Morishita family that they were not included in the sale. We replied on the 27th May, 1942, stating that these items were part of the sale (as the letter of March 6th, 1942, clearly established) and we accordingly returned the bill of sale to Mr. McPherson with a further sheet containing an inventory of these items which we asked to have attached to the bill of sale and initialled and returned to us. On the 3rd June Mr. Alexander replied returning the bill of sale with the additional page still attached to the bill of sale, but uninitialled, and asking for payment of the purchase moneys. In our reply of the same date we again reiterated our contention that the transaction definitely included the articles mentioned in our letter of the 27th May and stated that we would so contend if the question were ever again raised by Mr. Morishita.

We attach no significance to the fact that these articles were not included in an inventory which included only merchandise and no fixtures. This does not detract from the full effect of the letter of March 6th, 1942.

You point out that the prices of all articles are contained in the inventory of merchandise, whereas no prices are mentioned in the page containing the inventory of store fixtures. In the case of store merchandise it would be natural to insert the price as a basis for resale. On the other hand such items as the cash register and desk which were not for resale but which were kept for the Company's own use, did not require any valuation for purposes of resale.

We wish to point out that the Company has no desire to deprive the Japanese of anything to which he is entitled, but on the other hand, the evidence is clear that these items were included in the sale and there is no reason why the Company should withdraw from that position.


