Re: Haruko ODAGAKI #37477 & Shichitaro ODAGAKI #37454

Mr. Simmons, of the Dept. of Labour, reports that his department have in their records a waybill showing a shipment made by the B. C. Police, Port Alberni, to Mrs. ODAGAKI, on May 20, 1942. Shipment included a sewing machine.

On April 7, 1942, Mrs. ODAGAKI declared in regard to chattels: "Box #1 trunk, #2 box of clothing, #3 sewing machine, #4 box of glassware, #5 box of kitchen utensils, #6 box of needles, #7 pail of miso, #8 box of sauce, #9 & 10 boxes taken away, #11 1 bundle of books, #12 two boxes of stationery medicine kit, #3 one bundle mattress; these boxes were taken by the police dept. and stored in a special warehouse in Port Alberni, B. C."

On April 13, 1942, Mrs. ODAGAKI requested shipment of pieces Nos. 1, 2, 11 & 12. A Custodian Release, dated May 16, 1942, requests 11 pieces, numbered 1 to 9 and 11 and 12, and states that Nos. 1 and 2 had already been received. A notation on the Release in Custodian file states "Shipped by B.C. Police 19/5/42"

Mr. Shichitaro ODAGAKI declared on March 17, 1942, the contents of six rooms, including a pedal Singer machine, and various tools. On April 15, 1942, H.G. Hixon inventoried the contents of the house. The goods inventoried do not appear to be in any case those declared by Mrs. ODAGAKI, but the inventory states "other effects as per statement of owner stored in small storeroom in attic."

A Chattels Schedule, as at 13/11/44, the date on which the real property was sold indicates some goods still remaining at Port Alberni for Shichitaro ODAGAKI, and some tools missing. Without making a complete check of the husband's file I cannot state exactly what is missing among his chattels.

As shown, we have only a unsigned notation to show shipment of the articles requested by Mrs. ODAGAKI. It is possible that the shipment covered only the items requested, but might possibly have included some things that are not accounted for in the file of Shichitaro ODAGAKI.

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 7, 1942. She was evacuated on May 30, 1942.

In her declaration she reported 11 boxes of household and personal effects and foodstuffs stored at Port Alberni. These were all shipped to her at Hastings Park on May 19, 1942.

On May 15, 1945, we remitted the sum of \$50.00 to Mrs. ODAGAKI from the account of her husband, file 1634, as requested by him.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Gentlemen:

We thank you for your letter of April 29 and enclosures which we are returning herewith. We confirm our telephone conversation of this morning, in which we advised you that insofar as the Custodian's office is concerned, there was no objection to the shipment of Japanese effects from Port Alberni to Hastings Park in Vancouver, but that we did not assume any liability for the expense of shipment. We think therefore, that it would be necessary for you to answer the enclosed letters from the Japanese concerned and advise them that shipment of their effects can only be made if freight is paid by them on arrival of effects in Vancouver.
