At the Union Steamships dock here is one gramophone weighing one hundred and forty pounds for the above person with freight charges of \$1.05. It will take about fifty cents for cartage and seventy-five cents for freight to get this article to Hope. As it is outside the free list this party should either guarantee the freight or send enough money to the Union Steamships to pay all charges.

This woman evidently ordered this herself as we have no Custodian Release to Cover.
