This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. me did not carry any Pire insurance.

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 8/42 was evacuated on April 14/42, declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file, at the Brunswick Cannery. In accordance with a request contained in Gustodian release dated

July 13/43, the washing machine and the typewriter were shipped, but apparently not the boxes, books and records he asked for. A further Custodian release was received on Dec. 23/43 asking for the records, net twine, three boxes (no numbers given), picture without frame and corporter tools in box, and one big black box. These were shipped on March 27/44 as per memo on file of that date.

It will be noted that lumber sold for \$40.00 was originally credited the above, but as he did not declare it and his brother Tukinori did, this credit was transferred to the account of Tukinori. A band saw and motor, also credited to the above, has been transferred to the



Re: Japanese Property Claims Commission, Case 760 - Yukio Takasaki.

Mr. Shears has forwarded to me a copy of his letter dated December 29th, 1950 to Messrs. Virtue, Russell & Morgan with enclosure concerning the above-noted case. He also has advised me that he has written to you concerning this case and I believe will have provided you with copies of the correspondence.

The matter of particular concern to the writer relates to the chattels. You will observe in the copy of Mr. Virtue's letter under date of December 4th, 1950 he refers to a letter which he had received from the writer dated March 1st, 1950 wherein the writer stated as follows:

"Concerning the chattels I have made a settlement with Mr. Braidwood as appears on the
award form which we return herewith appearing
to be the best settlement I can make showing
\$511 in lost to which the ratio of \$41.9 will
apply. To expedite matters I will amend the
yellow award sheet and hand it to Mr.Braidwood.
We are returning the file under separate cover."

It would appear that the only Award Sheet which the Custodian has in his possession is the original

The Honourable Mr. Justice January 3, 1951. Bird: - 2 -Award Sheet which gives an award of only \$130.04 based on a chattels claim of \$220.00. Naturally Mr. Braidwood with whom I have been in touch has now no recollection of the matter and has been unable to locate the amended yellow award sheet referred to in my letter. Apparently the only record of the increase in the award is my letter referred to by Mr. Virtue. I am absolutely satisfied that I made the settlement with Mr. Braidwood on behalf of Mr. Virtue and that the amended award sheet was delivered to Mr. Braidwood's office. As we were at the time delivering large numbers of award sheets and likewise he was delivering award sheets to our office unfortunately we did not take receipts from each other for the same at that time. I realize therefore that the whole matter now dependsupon the writer's own integrity. In these circumstances unless adjustment in the award which my letter indicates was made by way of settlement between Mr. Braidwood and myself is given effect to my firm will be required to assume personal responsibility for the difference in the award settled upon and the award shown in your Lordship's report. Mr. Shears in his letter states: "Even if the arrangement was made, no change was made in the yellow award sheet and it is quite evident it was not submitted to the Commissioner as the Appendix to his Report only calls for an award of \$130.04 based on a claim for missing items amounting to \$220.00." I have drawn Mr. Shears' attention to the fact that this statement is not quite in accordance with the facts in that with respect to Mr. Virtue's cases settlements made with Mr. Braidwood were not reviewed by your Lordship as they were not cases where the writer represented the Toronto Committee. Therefore, the settlement which would appear by my letter to Mr. Virtue to have been made with Mr. Braidwood would not have gone before your Lordship for approval. It would appear that this is the only major error which has arisen in the technical working out of the settlement and we trust that the Government will see
