

This file shows that Mrs. Matsa HATANAKA, File No. 560, filed a claim for \$50.00 against this woman. Mrs. HAGANO, however, disputed this claim and stated that Mrs. HATANAKA owed her \$100.00. As we could not ascertain who was debtor and who, creditor, we wrote both of these women suggesting that settlement be made between themselves.

Mrs. Tami TAKESHITA, File 2638, filed a claim against this woman and her husband for \$90.00. Mr. Kameo HAGANO, File 12217, confirmed that he and his wife were indebted to Mrs. TAKESHITA, but stated that \$10.00 of the debt had already been paid, leaving \$80.00 still due Mrs. TAKESHITA.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

April 26, 1946.

Re: Yayo (Mrs. Kumao) NAGANO, Reg. No. 07440

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 8, 1946. She was evacuated on September 16, 1942.

In her declaration she reported 20 pieces stored at Port Alberni. On May 20, 1942, 15 pieces were shipped to Mrs. NAGANO at Hastings Park and 5 pieces were transferred to storage warehouse of Wm. Burnip at Port Alberni, including a barber chair, looking glass, bed, couch and bed spring. The file shows the barber chair and looking glass were requested on June 30, 1942 and lacking evidence to the contrary we assume that these were shipped. File shows that the couch was discarded and the bed and spring were sold at auction in January, 1944, and the net proceeds in the amount of \$12.80 were credited to the account of this woman.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
