This man, who was evacuated on July 25, 1942, signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 8, 1942.

In his declaration, he reported ownership of a \$50.00 Victory Bond in his own possession and stated that he had a bank account in the Bank of Montreal, Main & Hastings Street, Vancouver, with a credit balance of \$50.00. Neither of these assets came under the control of the Custodian.

Two radios were reported to the Custodian by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police as having been surrendered by Hitoshi NEKODA. These were sold, as shown by the Specified Articles Memorandum, and the net proceeds of the sale, in the amount of \$94.55, is standing to his credit with this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Your letter of January 8th, inquiring about the two radios surrendered by you, has been received. In reply we wish to advise that the radios and speaker have been sold for the net sum of \$94.55, which is standing in your account with the Custodian.

This money will be remitted to you if you will send us the receipt which you were given at the time you surrendered the radios.

In your declaration to the Custodian on April 8, 1942, you did not report ownership of the two radios. These were reported to this office by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

The Victory Bond and bank account, which you reported in your declaration to the Custodian, did not come under the control of this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this and also send us the radio receipt in proof of your ownership of the radios, we are enclosing a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
