



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

February 13, 1946.

Re: Akina ADACHI #06570

This woman in her declaration to the Custodian on April 8, 1942 declared two trunks in her house, Camp No. 1, Bloedel, B.C.

On May 5, 1942, Bloedel, Stewart & Welch, Ltd. informed us that the two trunks referred to had been forwarded to Vancouver. Mrs. ADACHI stated on July 2, 1942, that one trunk had been taken with her when she was evacuated and the other trunk was stored in the care of Mrs. Jim GILLESPIE at 7225 Blenheim St., Vancouver. Mrs. GILLESPIE confirmed that she was holding this trunk in July, 1942.

Mrs. GILLESPIE proved to be untrustworthy and this office had a great deal of trouble with her in regard to the Japanese house which she had rented and in regard to chattels stored in that house. On July 5, 1943, after Mrs. Gillespie had vacated these premises the trunk could not be located. It is possible that the trunk may have been shipped to Mrs. ADACHI.

This file reveals no other property of any kind. This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on on file.

The above has declared to the Custodian that she has left two trunks in her home at Camp #1 at Bloedel. We believe that this is your property, and we should be glad if you could confirm that these trunks will be in your care.

We believe that other Japanese evacuated from Bloedel may have left effects on your property and we should be very much obliged if you would advise us whether this is so. If anything has been left behind, we would request you make arrangements for its safe keeping, preferably in some central place and should ask you to dispose of any perishable goods.


