Naokiichi Hirota, file 7270, declared a dresser, chesterfield suite, and gramophone to be left at 73 - 9th Avenue, Hurray. A complete inventory of articles left in this house appears on file 7366, but does not appear to include the dresser or the chesterfield suite, though possibly the settee and an arm chair would meet the latter description. There are two gramophones, one of which may be assumed to be his.

Yasojiro Fushimura, file 7345, merely declared household furniture, odds and ends, at this address and his items may be assumed to be included in the inventory on 7366. *(later changed in report on his file 7345)*

Yasutaro Morikawa, file 7365, subsequently registered on August 27th, 1942, a number of items left at this address. It is impossible to identify these with the inventory shown on 7366 though it would appear that the contents of the locked room upstairs do not include by any means, all the eleven crates of miscellaneous goods declared, nor the small vacuum cleaner and other items.

Hiroshi Morita, file 1926, declared some items including a chesterfield left at 715 - 7th St., Mission, later to be left at the house of Y. Morikawa.

Dear Sir:

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted:

On May 1st, 1942 you declared certain household furniture and farm implements, including a Chesterfield suite. In checking up on the chattels found at 27, 5th Avenue, Honey, N. C. it appeared that certain other persons namely, Yasuhiro KUMAHARA, Yasojiro HIRAHARA, Hiroshi KUMITA and Naokiichi HIRATA had also left some of their possessions on these premises and we were unable at the time to determine the respective ownership.

In due course, the chattels were removed and sold at auction according to the Canadian Government's policy in the liquidation of Japanese effects and the proceeds of their sale was credited to your account. We are here to determine which of these items should be credited to the persons named other than yourself. We may mention that Dr. KUMITA declared a Chesterfield, four chairs, table, stove, dresser and bed, Dr. HIRAHARA declared household furniture, and china and glass and Dr. HIRATA declared a Chesterfield suite, grand piano and dresser.

It would appear that that you had declared some of the above mentioned effects as your own. Although, three persons declared a Chesterfield suite only one was found.

We are enclosing a copy of our sales sheets showing the items sold and would ask you to indicate thereon which of these are your own property and which items belong to the other persons. If you will then return the sales sheets we will make the necessary adjustments.
