I submit my report on the above Estate.

1. Location and Nature of Business.

Shoe Repair Business located at 221 Gore Avenue, Vancouver,
B. C.

3. Financial Position.

I have examined the inventory of equipment, furniture and
personal effects as per Form "JP", and subject to the fol-
lowing remarks, have found it correct with the exception of
a small heater not listed. The American shoe stitching
machine, shoe finishing Singer machine, trimming machine,
pressing machine and other small tools, have been given
to Denby Bros. & Co. Ltd., 163 West Pender Street, Vancouver,
B. C., under the Conditional Sales Agreement held by Denby
Bros. & Co. Ltd. This equipment was purchased from Denby
Bros. & Co. Ltd., March 1, 1942, for \$942.60. The unpaid
balance amounted to \$645.65, including \$20.55 on open account.
The arrangement between the declarant and Denby Brothers is
that in the event of the proceeds of the sale of the equip-
ment exceeding the liability of \$645.65, the excess will be
placed to the credit of the declarant.

I have been unable to discover liabilities other than that of
Denby Bros. & Co. Ltd. of \$645.65.

on the progress of the sale of equipment and when everything is
sold to forward a statement showing the proceeds of the sale and
amount due the ASAE estate, and to await my instructions before
remitting the funds to anyone.

We have your favor of the 27th inst. with
reference to Asae Kauchi.

We may explain that we had an account against
this party amounting to \$645.65. He turned over to us
two machines which we sold for \$531.00 and in turn we
applied this to his account, leaving a balance of \$114.65
still due. Against this we have the following second-
hand machines:

one Combination Sole Cutter & Skiver
one American Finisher
one Singer Patching Machine

We do not know how soon we will be able to
dispose of these owing to the number of such machines
we have on hand at present. So, we are unable to say
what these machines will bring; consequently, we are
unable to give any opinion as to whether these machines
