

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 8, 1942, stating that he owned no property of any kind left in the protected area. His file reveals no property of any kind.

However, Mrs. Mitsuko FURUKORI, File 10460, wife of this man declared a quantity of chattels left at Claxton Cannery. Mrs. FURUKORI was evidently a resident of Vancouver. Her husband was a netman at Claxton Cannery. It seems likely that the chattels at Claxton declared by the wife were the property of her husband. All saleable chattels, identified as the property of Mrs. FURUKORI remaining in July, 1945, were sold at auction at Prince Rupert, for the net sum of \$31.81, which has been credited to the account of Mrs. Mitsuko FURUKORI, File 10460.
