


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

Re: Estate of Richi Kawasoye.

The above named was a patient at the Provincial Mental Hospital, Escondale, B.C. for the period May 18th, 1945 to December 22nd, 1945. During his stay there the Attorney-General, for whom this office acts, was ex-officio committee of his estate and was charged with the duty of its administration.

I understand that Mr. Kawasoye was repatriated to Japan on May 31st, 1946. There is a cash balance of \$5.41 held in this office at his credit. These funds were amongst Mr. Kawasoye's possessions on his admission to hospital and were subsequently forwarded to this office by the hospital authorities. As it is the wish of the Department to return the money to Mr. Kawasoye I would be pleased to have your advice in this matter.

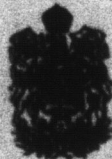
