No assets were declared by Kiyoshi UCHIYAMA. However the file indicates that he surrendered a radio to the R.C.M.P. as March 14th, 1942, their receipt for which is on file. This was later delivered to the Custodian and sold for a net amount of \$20.94 as December 20, 1943. Which amount was credited to his account on our books. The radio was described as an Admiral Radio, Ser. 9062.

No other assets of Kiyoshi UCHIYAMA are revealed on the file.

LIABILITIES:

The following Claims against Kiyoshi UCHIYAMA are revealed on the file.

All these claims were submitted to Kiyoshi UCHIYAMA and were admitted as indebtedness of his. Items 1 and 3 are now being settled through this office by credits to the respective accounts. Item 2 was withdrawn by Dr. UCHIDA by General letter of Aug 3, 1943 and therefore disregarded.

No other claims against or indebtedness of Kiyoshi UCHIYAMA are revealed on the file.

GENERAL SUMMARY

This man, who was evacuated on August 8, 1942, stated in his declaration to the Custodian on April 8, 1942, that he owned no property of any kind whatsoever left in the protected area.

The radio, of which details are given in Specified Articles Memorandum, was reported to this office by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. The net proceeds of the sale, \$20.94, have been credited to his account.

The liabilities, dealt with in detail, in the Liabilities Summary, have been acknowledged by him as being correct, but he has stated that he is unable to pay. His liabilities amount to \$69.13.

The file reveals no real property interest and no personal property other than the radio mentioned above is shown in this file.



MEMORANDUM

The above Japanese has a credit balance of \$20.94. He had admitted claims amounting to \$69.13. Dr. UCHIDA, one of the Claimants, for \$50.00 in a general letter August 3, 1943, asked that all claims of his be withdrawn. In the circumstances will it be proper to pay the others in full, a total of \$19.13 and remit the balance of \$1.81 to UCHIYAMA or should the Credit be paid pro rata on the admitted claims, \$69.13.

I think we should assume that Dr. Uchida, in withdrawing his claims is making the arrangements for their collection. In any case, after withdrawing them, he can scarcely expect the Custodian to deal with them in any way. I think you should deal with the matter as you suggest.

Dear Sir:-

We have reviewed your file and your affairs that have vested with the Custodian, in order that we may make a brief closing report. In doing so, it is noted that you declared that you had no property in the Protected Area of British Columbia. However, subsequently we found that you had surrendered an Admiral Radio to the R.C.M.P. in March 1942. This radio was later handed to the Custodian and sold for a net sum of \$20.94, which amount was credited to your account. You were advised of the sale in October 1945.

Certain claims were lodged against you in this office as follows:-

These you admitted as indebtedness of yours. Dr. UCHIDA advised us later that he wished to withdraw his claim. This then left Nos. 1 and 3 to settle, which we are now doing, and charging your account accordingly. After the payment of these, a balance of \$1.81 remains and we are enclosing a cheque for this amount herewith, payable to your order.
