

You will remember that on October 1st of last year, we wrote to you that we could find none of your belongings at 1662 West 2nd Avenue. Since that time the tenant, Mrs. Pearce, has reported to the Police the theft of a rice mill from these premises. We have no record of the owner of this rice mill which we believe to be Japanese-owned and without such information, we cannot lay a charge against the thief. Will you kindly let us know if you are, yourself, the owner of this rice mill or know anything of its ownership? Please do not fail to answer promptly as we are anxious to prosecute if a case can be established.

Dear Madam:

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted. At the time you made your declaration to the Custodian on May 29th, 1944, you declared household goods, but stated that you were not sure as to how much of these you would be taking with you. When our representatives visited your address at 1662 West 2nd Avenue, immediately after your evacuation, they found no personal property of any kind belonging to you. We advised you of this on October 1st, 1943, but received no reply to this letter. We assume therefore that you either disposed of your chattels prior to your evacuation or took them with you.

Your radio was sold at auction in Vancouver for the net sum of \$22.98, as you were advised in our letter of January 4th, 1946. We now enclose Custodian cheque in this amount, being your entire credit balance with this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.

DECLARATION AS TO LOSS OF RADIO RECEIPT

CANADA) IN THE MATTER OF a receipt for a radio owned by
 PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA) Matsuno (Mrs. Sueki) MURAKAMI of Slocan, B.C., housewife.
 TO WIT:)

I, Matsuno (Mrs. Sueki) MURAKAMI, of Slocan, B.C., housewife, do solemnly declare:

1. That I owned a radio, a General Electric Mantel type, No. 0473, and have personal knowledge of the facts herein declared.
2. That I had in my possession and control at Vancouver, B.C., a General Electric Mantel radio.
3. On the 2nd day of July, 1943, I delivered the said radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police at Vancouver, B.C., and obtained a receipt therefor.
4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt in all repositories where such receipt might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipt has been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.
5. That I have not in any way dealt with the said receipt or papers relating to the said radio and have not pledged or hypothecated the same or lodged the receipt with any person, firm or corporation as security.
6. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.
7. That I have been informed that my radio has been sold for the net sum of \$22.98.
8. That I, Matsuno (Mrs. Sueki) MURAKAMI, the owner, am therefore entitled to the proceeds from sale of my radio.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.
