PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Takeso UYENO, Reg. No. 07071

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942. He was evacuated on September 24, 1942.

In his declaration, he reported household goods left at Deep Bay. He did not list everything individually. He reported 45 items. On May 8, 1942, there were received at 992 Powell Street, in his name, 40 items. The five missing were probably shipped to him at Hastings Park prior to that date. It is impossible to reconcile the items received in the shipment of May 8, 1942, with the items released to him and the items sold. We are assuming that everything of value has been released or sold. Of the items listed in his declaration and later inventoried by this office only 2 chairs are missing. The net proceeds from the sale of articles identified as his property amounted to \$10.98.

The fishing boat declared has been identified as the "Bridgeport" sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$907.41.

The sum of \$14.45 was credited to the account of this man in full settlement of claim for refund of expenses incurred in connection with the impounding of his fishing vessel.

Altogether this account was credited with the net amount of \$932.84 from various sources. Remittances totalling \$750.00 were made to UYENO prior to his evacuation. At the present time his account shows a credit balance of \$182.84.

CHATTEL SUMMARY

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942. He was evacuated on September 24, 1942.

In his declaration, he reported 45 boxes of household goods, and he listed the contents of some of the boxes. Of the articles listed, it would appear that he must have taken with him or disposed of the sewing machine, one stove and the trunk, as these are not on the list of goods received at 992 Powell Street, on May 8, 1942. The other stove appears to have been released to him in September, 1942, before his evacuation.

Of the nine chairs declared, seven were sold. The other two were received at 992 Powell Street, on May 8, 1942, but are not shown to have been shipped or sold. These may have been discarded as valueless.

He declared fishing lead and boat tools. There were received in Vancouver 3 bundles of lead weights, some floats and a boat-mast. 4 boxes of fishing gear, 2 floats and a sack of lead weights were sent to Steveston for sale. No bid was received for the floats when offered for sale at Steveston Auction #36. It is possible that the other goods were also unsaleable.

In all 21 containers of various kinds were received on May 8, 1942, in the name of this man. The Releases cover 16 containers and 10 bottles of vinegar, leaving four unaccounted for (if we take the 10 bottles as the contents of one container) and this would appear to be the four boxes of fishing gear sent to Steveston. However, some small articles, a box & its contents and a cupboard were sold. These may have been in some of the boxes received, as we have no idea of the size of the various containers received nor of those released to him.

There is no record of the disposition of the wool, mattress, washboard, board or bed ends & sides. Some of these may have been shipped to him.

The items received and the items released cannot be reconciled. As he did not list individually the goods he left at Deep Bay (except in a few cases) it is not known whether or not his goods were all shipped to Vancouver. In view of this we can assume only that everything of value that was not released to him was sold, and that all the items shown on the auction sheets were his property.
