PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Takaji UYESUGI, Reg. No. 03032

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942, in which he reported that he had left with Bob Sloan, Wentworth St., Nanaimo 1 buffet, 1 china cabinet, 2 bureaus, 1 bed, 1 sewing machine.

On April 9th he reported to this office that he had received his sewing machine. In January, 1943, Mr. Sloan informed that he was holding all the articles except the sewing machine. However, Mr. Sloan signed an acknowledgment which he handed to Mr. J. W. James and this acknowledgment lists in addition to the items declared by UYESUGI 1 gramophone. On October 18, 1943, all the articles which had been in the care of Mr. Sloan were sold at auction at Nanaimo. The auction sheet shows that in addition to these items a walnut table not mentioned previously in this file was sold for the total sum of \$4.50. The net proceeds of the sale amounted to \$68.43, all of which was credited to this man's account. Mr. UYESUGI, on April 2, 1944, wrote this office objecting very definitely to the sale of his chattels. The net proceeds from the sale were sent to Mr. UYESUGI on July 31, 1944.

In his declaration this man reported a \$5.00 War Saving Certificate in his own possession and a \$5.00 War Saving Certificate in the possession of the Beban Lumber Co. at Nanaimo. These did not come under the control of this office. He also declared a Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada policy No. 866580 in his own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.

The file of Mrs. Takaji UYESUGI, file 2560, shows that she signed a declaration stating that she owned no property of any kind. A radio and camera were surrendered by Mrs. UYESUGI to the R.C.M.P. The radio was sold by the Custodian and the net proceeds of \$31.41 were remitted to her on January 4, 1945. The camera was delivered by the R.C.M.P. to the B.C. Security Commission on September 20, 1943, for shipment to the owner.

File 2090 reveals no other property of any kind.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.
