Re: Jitsuo UYEDE, Reg. 10966

In regard to the two fishing vessels reported by the RCMP, the above-mentioned person wrote on November 16, 1943:

"If there are any informations that I have owned more than one vessel it is, I should say, a plain error."

A number of persons, including the purchaser were under the impression that the vessel "Alma" was owned by Jitsuo UYEDE.

However, as Tatsuo MATSUMOTO, File 866, licensed owner of the "Alma", said that he owned this vessel, and the records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee showed that he had received the payment of \$100.00 made at the time of purchase, the sum of \$500.00 paid by the Canadian Fishing Company Ltd. in full settlement of the purchase price, on November 9, 1943, and January, 1944 (see letter of January 6, 1944) has been credited to Account No. 866.

Claim for \$50.25 received from Canadian Government in payment of transportation expenses in connection with the impounding of the vessel "Alma" was credited to the account of Jitsuo UYEDE, as both he and Tatsuo MATSUMOTO reported that this vessel had been brought from Prince Rupert to Steveston by Jitsuo UYEDE.

Your letter dated September 30th was held in this office until my arrival in Vancouver from the North. Please accept our apologies for the delay.

This man had two boats, I known as "J.U." as described in your letter and also another older boat called the "Alma". These boats were both purchased through me for the Canadian Fishing Co. Ltd. The "J.U." was purchased for \$500.00 and this amount was paid in to the Fishing Vessels association in March, 1942. The "Alma" was purchased at the same time for the sum of \$100.00 and this money also paid into the same association.

The "Alma", being an old boat, did not sell for some time and this man asked the writer if we would purchase it from him and if, at any time in the future we were able to dispose of it to one of our fishermen, to do so. We sold this boat to one of our fishermen quite recently for the sum of \$600.00 and set up a credit in our books for the sum of \$500.00 for account of Uyede. The Company was not obligated in any way to make a further payment on this boat but felt that as we had this man working for us for a considerable length of time and found him quite fair, felt that the additional money on the sale should go to him. This money can be sent to you upon request at any time.

In your statement of personal property, you list a boat sold to Oceanic Cannery, Skeena River. This boat is described as, 28 feet by 6 8/12 feet, by 2 1/2 feet. You state that the sum of \$500.00 was due you from the purchasers of your boat.

According to our records, you sold the Canadian Fishing Company Ltd. a boat called the "J.U." (no license number given) for the sum of \$500.00 on February 24, 1942, and received in payment the sum of \$495.00 on April 1, 1942. The difference of \$5.00 was the deduction of Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee charges. The "J.U." is described as, 33 feet by 7 1/2 feet by 3 1/2 feet.

Information supplied to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police is that you owned two boats, one chartered to the Canadian Fishing Company Ltd.

Would you kindly let us know if the boat listed in your statement of property was the "J.U."?

If you owned two boats, would you please give us all the information you can supply in regard to both boats; such as, dimensions, engine, license number, name of boat, age, and (in the event of both boats having been sold) let us know if there is still money owing to you from the purchasers.

"Alma" confirmation of the fact that you had brought this vessel to Steveston at the time of the impounding, we have placed to the credit of your account the sum of \$50.25, in settlement of claim for expenses incurred by you in bringing the "Alma" to Steveston and returning to Prince Rupert.

The Canadian Fishing Company Ltd. filed against you a claim for \$46.50. This claim is made up as follows:

This would leave you indebted to the company for the sum of \$50.00. However, the company owed you wages, (7 hours at 50 cents an hour) a total of \$3.50, making the sum which they state is owing to them \$46.50. Would you kindly let us know if this is correct? If you do not agree, give us information that will enable us to clear this claim from your file. If it is correct, please authorize us to settle the claim from the funds standing to your credit.
