GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 2100

October 6, 1947.

Re: Noboru YUKIMOTO, Reg. No. 10270

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 20, 1942. He was evacuated on March 21, 1942.

CHATELS

YUKIMOTO reported one mattress and a list of logging equipment left at Third Lake, Stillwater, N. C. He stated that some of the equipment was left in the shed and some in the bush.

As the evacuation from Stillwater was very sudden, the Japanese had no time to arrange for the shipment or storage of their goods. For this reason, little or no chattels at Stillwater have been accounted for. Mr. Green's memo of April 30, 1943, states that identification of tools left in the camps was impossible and that tools left in the bush could only be located by the Japanese themselves. No further action can be taken in regard to YUKIMOTO's chattels unless he should claim for their loss.

MONIES OWING

YUKIMOTO reported \$590.00 owing him by Robert McNair Shingle Company for chuting bolts. In answer to our enquiry, P. S. Moss & Sons stated in letter of July 12, 1946, that YUKIMOTO was not on the records of M. EBISUZAKI Company, who operated two large camps at Stillwater. This claim had been referred to P. S. Moss & Sons because many such claims had been settled through M. EBISUZAKI Company.

In view of the fact that YUKIMOTO does not appear to have been employed by M. EBISUZAKI Company, we are writing to Robert McNair Shingle Company for any information they may have in regard to this claim. *see reply Oct 10/47.*

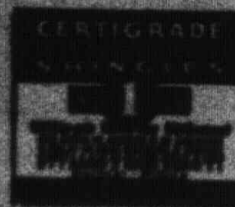
EXCERPT FROM LETTER FROM P. S. ROSS & SONS, DATED JULY 12, 1946,  
ON FILE OF Yoshikazu SUZUKI, File No. 2510

"In addition to the foregoing we have received advice from you of a claim by one Neburo YUKIMOTO, Neg. No. 10270, for \$590.00.

Neither TAIRA nor SUZUKI mention anyone of this name and it may be that YUKIMOTO was working for some one else in the neighbourhood. There were other shingle bolt operations at Stillwater, other than the camps operated by M. EBISUZAKI Company."

Your letter of the 7th received and in reply wish to say that Kaino had a contract on an area entirely different from Ebisuzaki Company, and he employed not more than half a dozen men.

We have settled up in full with Kaino. Mr. Yukimoto resumably worked for Kaino, and we have no knowledge as to whether Kaino made any settlement with him or not. We had no direct dealings with Yukimota.
