GENERAL SUMMARY

July 8, 1946.

Re: Dani YOSHIKUNI, Reg. No. 07539

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942. He died at Hastings Park on July 12, 1942.

In his declaration he reported 12 packages left at the millist Great Central, B.C. On May 16, 1942 he requested shipment of 9 of these pieces and on June 23, 1942 he requested shipment of 1 more piece. In October, 1942, Messrs. Bloodal, Stewart & Walsh Ltd. wrote that all the effects belonging to this man had been shipped.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$2.96 as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

The B.C. Security Commission filed a claim for \$50.00 to cover funeral expenses of this man. We are today remitting his credit balance of \$2.96 to be applied on this claim.

This file reveals no other liabilities of any kind.

The file of this man's wife reveals no liabilities of any kind.

Re: Denji YOSHIKUNI, Deceased

Thank you very much for your letter dated August 19th informing us that Mr. Denji Yoshikuni, Registration No. 07539, had died at Hastings Park Clearing Station on July 12th. Your letter places your claim with us for \$50.00 covering the above-mentioned's burial expenses which you request us to recover for you from his estate.

Upon checking our files covering Mr. and Mrs. Yoshikuni, we find that Mr. Yoshikuni had no liquid assets but that Mrs. Yoshikuni declared to us on April 7th that she was holding as of that date one War Savings Certificate valued at \$5.00 and War Savings Stamps valued at approximately \$2.00.

In addition, Mr. and Mrs. Yoshikuni both declared that remaining in Grand Central, B.C. was one sewing machine, 1 box of kitchen utensils, a bed and some Japanese food. To all intents and purposes, therefore, to the best of our knowledge Mr. Denji Yoshikuni had no estate, as Mrs. Yoshikuni presumably may take the stand that the sewing machine is her own property. In fact, however, the sewing machine has vested in the Custodian and if it is your desire that we take further action in this connection we shall be happy to discuss with Mrs. Yoshikuni the question of our arranging for the sale of the sewing machine in order that the burial expenses of her late husband may be settled.

On the other hand, if we do not hear from you further in this connection we shall take it that you do not desire us to take any action in this connection in view of the nature and extent of Mrs. Yoshikuni's assets. Neither Mr. or Mrs. Yoshikuni have declared any life insurance or bank accounts.


