A claim in the sum of \$38.25 was filed against Mr. HORII by the Vancouver General Hospital on Dec. 28/42. On Dec. 23/44 he sent us \$15.00 to apply on this account and stated that he would pay the balance the next year. No further remittances have been received from him and on June 5/45 we advised the hospital that Mr. HORII had no funds with this office and suggested they contact him direct at Lillooet. We have today written to his wife suggesting her balance of \$10.25 be applied against this account. In letter dated Dec. 18/46 Mrs. HORII asks that the balance of \$10.25 in her account be sent to the Hospital in part payment of this account and that they will pay the balance of \$13.00 next year.

This file reveals that Mr. HORII owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: Mr. HORII, who made his declaration to the Custodian on Apr. 10/42 and was evacuated on May 19/42, declared furniture, household effects and kitchen utensils at 368 Heatley Ave. On April 11/42 he signed a statement saying that the furniture, household effects and kitchen utensils declared by him, would be removed to Lillooet or sold prior to his evacuation.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: The fishing vessel declared by HORII was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$3608.50, and this sum paid to HORII on 8/28/42.

WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATE: He declared one \$5.00 War Savings Certificate. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

LIFE INSURANCE: He declared a life insurance policy with the Sun Life Assurance Co. in the sum of \$1500.00, the beneficiary being his wife, Sumiye. This policy was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

In reply to your letter of the 9th instant, we would advise that we have credited your account with the sum of \$10.25, being the balance of your account with the Japan and Canada Trust Company.
