This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 23, 1942, the day of his evacuation.

Chattels: Nine pieces of household effects were declared. Of these eight were shipped to his wife on May 25, 1942. The other, a heater, could not be found. There was no record, according to report from B. C. Police, January 22, 1943, of a heater owned by this man being at the Japanese Hall, Port Alice, the place where he had reported it as being left. Further details are given in Chattels Summary.

Vessel: The 24 foot boat, dealt with in Vessels Summary, was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$30.00. The engine of this boat was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$10.26. These funds were credited to this man's account.

Securities: Victory Bond \$400.00 at Royal Bank, Main & Hastings, Vancouver
War Savings Certificates \$75.00, in owner's possession.
These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Bank Account: Royal Bank, Main & Hastings, Vancouver, \$1,200.00

These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

CHATELS SUMMARY

In his declaration to the Custodian, this man declared nine pieces of kitchen and household effects stored at the Japanese Hall, Port Alice. He gave no further details in regard to the character of the effects.

According to Custodian Release, May 18, 1942, on File 517, and letter of November 16, 1942, from C. A. Bellhouse, of the B. C. Police, Port Alice, eight pieces of household effects were shipped to Mrs. Martha YANO, File 517, wife of this man, on May 25, 1942.

On November 4, 1942, Masayuki YANO requested shipment of one heater stove. This was referred to Mr. Bellhouse, who reported that he had no record of this article. Mrs. Martha YANO reported in December, 1942, that this heater had been left in their former residence at Port Alice. Mr. Bellhouse investigated but could find no record whatever of this heater, and he stated that the police assumed no responsibility of articles left outside the Hall. This article must have been removed from their former residence by some unauthorized person.

Dear Sir:

As requested by you, we enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the amount of \$40.26, representing all the funds standing to your credit with this office.

These funds were derived from the sale of your boat and engine, as you were advised on April 16, 1945.

In your declaration to the Custodian, you reported nine pieces of household effects left at the Japanese Hall, Port Alise. Of these articles eight were shipped to Mrs. Yano, on May 25, 1942. The other piece appears to be the heater about which you inquired in November, 1942. It would appear, however, that this article was not left at the Japanese Hall, Port Alise, and an investigation by the police, in December, 1942, revealed no trace of this item at your former residence in Port Alise.

The Victory Bond and War Savings Certificates which you declared did not come under the control of the Custodian, and the same is true of your bank accounts and life insurance policy.

The camera about which you inquired in your letter was reported to this office by Mrs. Monks as being the property of your wife, and we have written to Mrs. Yano informing her that the Custodian has no objection to shipment being made.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the enclosed cheque, we attach a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
