In short, such equipment as has been left behind, is perfectly safe as it could not be removed without Mr. Nat McMair knowing about it. However, for the most part, it cannot be identified and we shall therefore have to advise the Japanese concerned that we can only assume that the tools they have declared to the Custodian are actually there. It would cost more than the value of these tools to take them away."
