PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Saburo Yagi was evacuated March 12, 1942. He signed JP September 5, 1943. His wife, Misako Yagi, was evacuated June 5, 1942. She signed JP March 27, 1942.

In her JP Mrs. Yagi declared the following personal property:

"At P.O. Box 667, Dyke Rd., E. Richmond, New Westminster, B. C.
1 New Electric Motor Singer Sewing Machine }
1 Latest Model Hardwood Dresser } Total value \$400.00
1 New Double Bed }
1 Latest Model New Kitchen Stove }
1 New Large Trunk }
China, Silverware & Kitchenware - valued at \$100.00."

Saburo Yagi declared, "About \$500.00 worth of furniture, bedsets and stove, etc. are in the boathouse which is located on Dyke Road, East Richmond, B.C."

On Sept. 18, 1943, Mr. Green wrote Mr. & Mrs. Yagi, informing them that soon after evacuation the house of Sakuji Kanegawa (which had been occupied by this couple) had been investigated, but no articles of any value were found. The house had been examined by the police and found to be properly locked and nailed. The letter suggested that, as the house had been in an isolated spot, it was likely that Mrs. Yagi had made some other arrangements for storing her effects. A request for further information was made in the letter.

No reply was received from Mr. & Mrs. Yagi and no further action taken by the Custodian.

The goods listed above was the only property declared by these people.

The records of the Japan & Canada Trust Company showed a balance of \$1.21 on deposit in the account of Saburo Yagi, of Ocean Falls. We have a record of only one Saburo Yagi, and he was formerly at Ocean Falls. Therefore the money has been credited to Saburo Yagi and will be remitted to him.

Sakuhei Izukawa filed claim for \$50.00 against Saburo Yagi, of Ocean Falls. This claim has not been referred to Yagi, because he had, until recently, no funds in Custodian account,; the funds now in the account are too insignificant to bother applying against this alleged debt. Izukawa is being supplied with the present address of Yagi.

Re: Mr. & Mrs. Saburo YAGI

No answer has been received to ours of September 18th, 1943, to the husband and wife. Reference to file 1384, being that of the owner of the premises where these goods were allegedly left, shows that the writer had considerable doubt as to the genuineness of the declaration on that file. The same appears to apply to the two Japanese under consideration. If they did leave their belongings in this unguarded spot, they were most negligent.

We recommend that no further steps be taken in this matter and without additional particulars, no possible claim be considered.

Dear Sir and Madam:-

Mrs. Saburo Yagi declared an electric Singer sewing machine and some valuable furniture and effects left at her house rented from Mr. Sakuji Kanegawa (our file 1984) on the East Richmond Dyke Road. We overlooked this declaration in making our investigation of this property and it was not until we received Mr. Saburo Yagi's registration dated September 5th declaring about \$500.00 worth of effects at the same place that our attention was drawn to this.

Very soon after the evacuation, however, we investigated Mr. Sakuji Kanegawa's place and found no articles there of any value. The premises were examined by the police and found to be properly locked and nailed although as this is in an isolated spot, we should not expect anything of value to be safe there. Mr. Sakuji Kanegawa did declare quite a number of valuable articles which could not be traced and we can only assume that these were stolen. We find it hard to believe that Mrs. Saburo Yagi would not have made arrangements at least for the safekeeping of the electric sewing machine and that she or some of her friends must have contacted some of the Japanese Committee at New Westminster regarding the removing to storage of the balance. May we please have further information from you?
