PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

July 9, 1946.

Re: Masu (Mrs. Kaizo) KAMACHI, Registration No. 09957

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 27, 1942. She was evacuated on July 4, 1942.

In her declaration she reported a sewing machine, 3 trunks and 16 boxes containing silverware and china left at 2818 Rock Bay Ave., Victoria in the care of Mr. Frank Thomas. On referring this to Mr. Thomas he reported holding sewing machine, 3 trunks and 13 boxes and this was confirmed by Mrs. KAMACHI on October 13, 1942. 2 trunks and 6 boxes were shipped to Mr. KAMACHI and the remaining chattels were sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$69.84 were credited to the account of her husband, File No. 1580.

She reported a bank account in the Bank of Montreal with a balance of \$1.12. On December 12, 1945 the account of this woman was credited with the sum of \$11.10 received from the Bank of Montreal as balance of account not operated for 5 years. We are today remitting this amount to Mrs. KAMACHI.

She reported a life insurance policy for \$1,000.00 with the Sun Life Assurance Co. On May 23, 1945 the amount of \$59.49 was remitted to the Sun Life through this office from the account of this woman's husband to be applied on this policy.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

(A) - The disposition of the 13 cartons and wooden boxes, 3 large trunks and 1 crate containing a sewing machine stored in a friend's basement at 2118 Rock Bay, Victoria, is not quite clear. Some were shipped and the balance appears to have been moved to the Willows and sold there. A mantle clock and two medical instruments shown on Auction Sheet, dated Dec. 12/44, do not appear in inventory but are taken as coming out of one or more of the 13 cartons. Evidence on wife's file (2194) shows 1 trunk shipped Nov. 23/42 and another shipped Dec. 29/42, leaving 1 apparently still at 2118 Rock Bay, regarding which enquiry is now being made.
