PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 2314

Re: Todashi NODA, Reg. No. 09923

In his declaration to the Custodian, on March 27, 1942, this man declared a quantity of equipment used in connection with his business as a masseuse, as well as furniture and other chattels. All these effects were left in the care of Mr. & Mrs. Bertrand, 2130 Weald Road, Uplands, Victoria, B. C.

No detailed inventory of his effects was made until February, 1943, when all chattels remaining at 3130 Weald Road were removed to The Willows. At that time a list of the goods stored at The Willows was sent to NODA, who in reply requested shipment of a quantity of his chattels. It would appear that shipment was made as requested. On December 18, 1944, a large quantity of chattels, identified as the property of this man, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$269.15, which was credited to his account. On January 4, 1945, chattels of this man remaining were shipped to Vancouver for storage. On September 14, 1945, the items in storage at Vancouver were shipped to him. In addition to the net proceeds from the auction sale, this file shows the following credits and debits in connection with the chattels of this man. On March 9, 1943, we received from Pemberton & Son Ltd. cheque for \$2.59 representing refund of unexpired premium on Scottish Union & National Insurance Company policy #F679856. On September 15, 1945, we paid Bowman Storage Ltd. \$27.88 to cover packing, hauling and freight to Greenwood on 5 cases of personal effects. On March 7, 1946, we paid to the Dept. of Labour \$38.41 to cover shipping costs Greenwood to Hamilton on his personal effects and 67 cents to Custodian Petty Cash to cover shipping costs on his 3 cameras.

In his declaration he reported book debts of approximately \$200.00, but as he did not give any details, and stated that these were old debts that had been written off by him, no action was taken by this office in regard to these.

He reported \$300.00 in Victory Bonds in his safety deposit box No. 83 at the Royal Bank of Canada, Fort Street, Victoria, and a bank account #100 at the same branch of the Royal Bank. These did not come under the control of this office.

Among the articles left with Mr. & Mrs. Bertrand, were a radio, 3 cameras and a shotgun, which were turned over to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. The radio was sold by the Custodian for \$38.41, which was credited to the account of NODA, the 3 cameras were shipped to him, the shotgun is in the hands of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
