Dear Sir:

In response to your recent request we attach hereto our cheque in the amount of \$347.79. This is your entire credit balance with this office and the remittance closes the account.

You did not declare any real or personal property, but a Chevrolet car declared by your wife, was found to be registered in your name and the proceeds from this sale were therefore credited to your account.

We note that you declared a Dominion of Canada \$50.00 Victory Bond as being left at your home, but we consider this unlikely as anyone would naturally take their securities with them when leaving.

There was a debt of \$431.00 which you declared owing to you by a Mr. Fudemoto, but as you could give us no information as to this man's whereabouts, we were unable to try to collect this account for you.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.



He is credited however, with the sum of \$347.79, covering sales proceeds of a 1935 Chevrolet car. This car was declared by his wife, but the funds are credited to his account as the car was registered in his name.

Correspondence on this file relative to the cleaning equipment, the violin and radio, is irrelevant, being dealt with on his wife's file, No. 7842.


