These claims were filed with the Canadian Government by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee and when settlement was made by the Government funds were paid in to the Custodian's office. The only concern this office has had with these claims is to see that the account of the person concerned is credited with the amount of his claim as shown by the list which the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee turned over to this office. We are therefore not in a position to deal with this claim for \$99.00.

Your credit balance with this office at the present time is \$401.14, made up of the \$12.25 received in full settlement of the claim mentioned above, and the sum of \$388.89 representing the net proceeds from the sale of the vessel PT.S.*, Victoria lienece 1841.



Claimant on his J.P. placed the value of his boat at \$1000. He did not declare any gear.

O.W. Phillipson reported that the boat was in very poor condition evidently having been laid up, it needed extensive repairs on deck and was practically of no sales value.

Claim 2 Boat & Fishing Gear

No record.

There is no record of what equipment was on the boat when surrendered but claimant stated that it was all on the boat when the boat was taken away from him. An anchor was supplied by the Custodian to the boat and other equipment which was missing and the cost \$42.45 was paid from Naval Claim Fund.

It is submitted that the boat was sold at its fair market value.
