

Re: Appraisal of goods at Sunnyside Cannery.

Much old junk and decaying mattresses were in an old shed. The shed has been broken into and the break in the wall has let in the weather. The goods would all appear to be valueless, with the possible exception of a blacksmith's blower and an old 4 h.p. Easthope engine. However from the juxtaposation of these articles with the rest of the junk, it would appear that the former owner placed no value on them.

Blacksmith's blower- incomplete, old and rusty, the back shield is eaten away and must be replaced. Cost when new \$30.00.

Present value: \$15.00

4 h.p. Easthops engine-

1929 model. Has been unused for a long time and it is doubtful whether it is of any use. Must be thoroughly cleaned and overhauled to find out if it complete and usuable. Was sold by the B.C. Packers to the present Japanese owner, in 1935 for \$25.00 and has been used to supply power for a small grinder.

In view of your declaration this office did not search for any erty belonging to you at Sunmyside Cannery and it was not until December, 1944, when the cannery reported that they wished to destroy the old shed on cannery ground in which some chattels belonging to Japanese charges had been tored, that this office was soure of the existence of any such property when the Custodian agent visited Sunnyside Camery in December, 1944, and examined the shed the only articles of value found were the engine and blacks mith blower shiels were sold by this office, The namegor of the cannery stated that these were your perperty and the proceeds of the sale were therefore prodited to your account, The commery memager reported to the Custodian agent that this shed had been broken into, He also reported to the Custodian agent that at the time of the evacuation Japanese residents at Sunnyside Connery had packed all valuable goods in a number of packages ready for shipping and that these goods had since been shipped. All other goods which the owners considered not worth moving had been placed in this old shed, This information does not agree with the information gives in your letter of March Lithe Houses, since you did not consider those articles of sufficient value to report them to the Quetodism until appreximately four years after your evacuation we can only assume that the information given to us by the same or at Sunsystde Conyou left in the protected area has been accounted for, as the property which you reported to the Custodian in your declaration has certainly all been se-Yours truly. 

When the Gustedien egent vicited Sunnyeide Connery in Counter, 1944. and exemined the shed the only articles of value found were the engine and blacksmith blower which were sold by this office. The manager of the cannery stated that these were your property and the proceeds of the pale were therefore credited to your account.

Mr. J.H. Mair, Prince Rupert, Appraiser, reported that he visited the shed at the cannery and found much old junk in the shed and would appear to be valueless. He appraised the Blacksmith's Blower at \$15. and the 4 H.P. Easthope Engine at \$15. which were sold by tender for \$50.

The ceiling price of the Radio, which was sold by auction for \$31., was \$40.

It is submitted that most of the items claimed for were undeclared and were not found and it is also submitted that the concealment was deliberate and that no claim should be made and that the items found and sold were sold for their fair market value.
