



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 2396

Re: Tokuzo SHIMADA, Reg. No. 09467

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 20, 1942. He was interned on March 21, 1942, but was released from internment on November 13, 1942, and on August 2, 1946, was repatriated.

No real property is revealed by this file.

SHIMADA reported that 2 boxes containing clothing, personal effects, toys and dolls were left by him at Woodfibre. A quantity of goods, in the name of T. SHIMADA, were received from Woodfibre on May 21, 1942. Most of these goods were furniture to which no further reference is made in this file and it is believed that an error was made in the name of the owner at the time of shipment; this error later being discovered upon examination of the goods. Goods identified as the property of T. SHIMADA, of Woodfibre, were sold at auction. The tricycle sold was reported by SHIMADA in his letter of August 13, 1942. Most of the other items apparently were the contents of the two boxes originally declared. A cupboard and a chest drawers which were not declared by SHIMADA were sold and the funds credited to his account. These items were among the goods shipped from Woodfibre under his name and apparently were identified as his property at the time of sale. The net proceeds from the sale of chattels identified as belonging to SHIMADA were \$44.98, which have been credited to his account.

SHIMADA declared a \$50.00 Victory Bond in his own possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

SHIMADA declared 16 \$8.00 War Savings Certificates. These were received by the Custodian and placed in safe-keeping on October 13, 1942. On August 8, 1946, at SHIMADA's request, the Certificates were sent to the Registrar of War Savings Certificates for redemption, and the sum of \$142.50, redemption value, was received and credited to the account of SHIMADA on August 17, 1946.

SHIMADA declared an account in the Royal Bank of Canada. On September 15, 1942, the sum of \$308.45, being the credit balance at that date, was received and placed to the credit of SHIMADA with this office.

On September 15, 1942, the sum of \$14.89 was received from the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Company and was credited to SHIMADA's account. This sum was the balance in his account at that date.

The sum of \$7.77 was received from the Provincial Government of British Columbia in October, 1942, as refund of one per cent wage deductions for 1941.

The sum of \$3.70 was received from the Department of Labour on October 20, 1942. This appears to have been wages due SHIMADA from that Department.

The sum of \$12.07 was received on January 25, 1947, as refund of overpayment of 1945 Income Tax.

Of the funds credited to SHIMADA's account, \$379.79 was released to him at the time of his repatriation. The \$154.57 credited since his repatriation is free.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

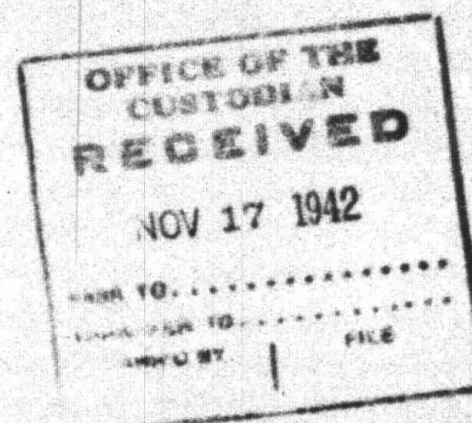
