

The property proved unretnable and unsaleable throughout the period of Custodian administration.

Yuji SHIMASAKI was advised (Apr. 4/49) that Orders-in-Council under which Custodian office operated lapsed March 31st, 1949, and that Custodian vesting was being lifted, property being released to control of registered owners as from May 15th, 1949. To this Yuji SHIMASAKI has replied: "Please do as you see fit as I do not want the above property."

Susumu HOMMA returned to Japan August 2nd, 1946, via S.S. "General Meigs".

This 57-year old Naturalised-Canadian Fisherman from Skeena River, B. C., signed a Custodian "JP" form on the 24th March, 1942. He was evacuated on May 7th, 1942.

His wife, Utaye, File 219, signed a Custodian "No Property" card on the 24th March, 1942. She was evacuated on the 7th May, 1942.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: See Real Property Summary, dated May 11th, 1949, for particulars of half interest in Port Essington property, which remained unsold and has been returned to control of owner with lifting of Custodian vesting as of May 15th, 1949.



As you are doubtless aware, the Order-in-Council which prohibited persons of the Japanese race from entering the Protected Area of British Columbia without permit has been revoked, such revocation being effective April 1st, 1949.

Our records indicate that you are the registered owner of a one-half interest in the above property, the registered owner of the other half-interest being Susumu HOMMA (File 598), who was repatriated to Japan August 2nd, 1946. During the past few years this property has been vested in, and subject to the control of, the Custodian. This letter is to advise you that as of May 15th, 1949, the Custodian intends to file a Vacating Certificate with the Registrar of Lands and thereafter the responsibility for administering this property will revert to you.

For your information, the arrangements existing at the present time are as follows:

(1) Messrs. H. G. Halgerson Ltd., 216 Sixth Street, Prince Rupert, are Custodian Agents for the property. They are being sent a copy of this letter and requested to render their final account for it to this office on May 15th, 1949.

(2) We enclose Tax Notice (our only copy) for 1948, from which you will see that delinquent taxes amounted to \$179.95, to which 1948 taxes in the sum of \$20.36 were added on October 31st, each year's total being subject to interest @ 4% per annum from date it became delinquent. As advised you in our letter of February 28th, the Provincial Collector has been advised that the Custodian is not liable for these taxes and that as far as this office is concerned the property may be subject to ordinary tax sale proceedings.

(3) You carried no insurance on this property and none has been taken out by the Custodian.

(4) It has been the policy of the Custodian to make properties revenue-producing whenever possible but this property proved unrentable throughout the period of our administration.

As advised you on the 12th February, the question of this camera was taken up with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. After going into the matter they replied to the effect that the camera was never received by them. This necessitates following the matter up with the Navy, and while we regret the delay this will involve, it will be done and you will be advised of the result in due course.


