PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARYRe: OKINO, Consuke - Reg. No. 06601.

The above signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 9, 1942 and was evacuated on September 9, 1942.

CHATELS: He declared that he owned furniture and household goods in a cabin at the Great Northern Cannery.

When the chattels from the Great Northern Cannery were moved to 604 East Cordova a lot of goods were inventoried under No. 302, in the name of OKINO. Lists of chattels moved from the cannery were sent to the Japanese who had formerly lived there. OKINO marked which goods belonged to him and the proceeds of sale of same has been credited to his account. He marked 1 cabinet as belonging to him and, though one appears on Inventory 302 it is believed to belong to some other Japanese as there is a note at the bottom of the inventory to the effect that 1 cabinet marked OKINO was being left in the care of a Mr. J.F. Bruce who desired to purchase it. We have written to the Cannery Manager to find out what became of the cabinet. The cabinet which is listed on Inventory 302 has been transferred to Chattel Suspense Account. *Cabinet in Vancouver - no sale - advised OKINO to make own arrangements 7/8/46*

OKINO signed a list which consisted of one Enterprise Range and of one Monarch Range said to be left at the Cannery. Later, in March 1943 he wrote asking about his Enterprise Range and did not mention the Monarch. These ranges have been sold and the proceeds from the Enterprise has been placed to his credit. Proceeds from the Monarch are in Chattel Suspense Account until we can ascertain from OKINO whether he owned the two ranges.

Of the remaining goods appearing on Inventory 302, a High chair and Ice Box have been identified as belonging to Tomey HOMMA, File 10946 and proceeds of same transferred to his account. The cabinet and a camp chair are in Chattel Suspense Account. Mr. Wills advises that the remaining items have all been discarded. In any case they were not claimed by OKINO.

Total proceeds from Chattels amount to: \$45.15

BANK

ACCOUNT: He declared \$100.00 in the Japan and Canada Trust Savings. His name does not appear on the list of accounts and it is presumed that the balance was withdrawn sometime between his declaration to the Custodian and his evacuation.

This file reveals no other assets than those mentioned above.

Dear Sir:

We acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 14, 1947. We have delayed replying as we have been corresponding with Mr. J. P. Bruce, formerly of the Great Northern Cannery, who was holding a cabinet belonging to you. It appears that he was dealing with you, through a Mr. Robertson, with a view to purchasing it. Mr. J. P. Bruce advised us that this cabinet is stored with a relative in Vancouver. We have contacted this person and are endeavouring to sell your cabinet as Mr. Bruce does not wish to purchase it, but have had no success. Should we be able to dispose of it, the proceeds will be remitted to you.

The chattels which you left at the Great Northern Cannery, except the cabinet mentioned above, have all been sold and we enclose herewith our cheque for \$45.15 which represents the net proceeds of their sale. This is the total credit standing to your account with this office.

When we sent you a list of the chattels moved from the Great Northern Cannery, we also included a list of goods left at the Cannery, namely a Monarch Range and an Enterprise Range. You marked your name besides both items but later enquired about the Enterprise Range only. This has been sold, the proceeds being included in the cheque for \$45.15. It would appear that the Monarch Range belonged to another person and we would very much appreciate it if you would indicate who was the owner of the Monarch Range.

We enclose herewith a stamped, self-addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Dear Sir:

In our letter of March 29th. we advised you that the cabinet you had left with Mr. J. F. Bruce was stored in Vancouver with a relative. We have, as you know, endeavoured to sell this to Mr. Bruce but he is not interested and neither is the person with whom it is now stored.

The value of the cabinet does not make it advisable to move it as it is very doubtful whether it can be sold. We regret, therefore, that we can do nothing further to help you, under these circumstances. You are at liberty to make any arrangements that you may desire.
