This will acknowledge yours of February 2nd in connection with the above, in which you have requested information with regard to certain accounts claimed to be owing him by other Japanese.

We are unable to reconcile Mr. Hinton's claim as set out in the second paragraph of your letter, to the effect that he assigned four accounts to the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association on March 8th, 1940.

As a matter of fact Mr. E. Hinton, trading as the Canadian Food Distributors, gave this Association a power of attorney on March 7th, 1941, permitting us to take possession of his business and liquidate it for the benefit of his creditors. At that time he furnished us with a list of accounts owing by him and attached you will find copy of this as finally determined after various items were investigated by us. From that you will note that S. Sakunishi is listed with a claim of \$18.05. The others mentioned in your letter do not appear to have been declared to us at the time these affairs were placed in our hands.

With regard to Sakunishi, at the time we investigated his affairs on your behalf, it appeared that there was an account owing in connection with a personal loan made by S. Hinton in the amount of \$362.50 and accordingly not an account owing by him. *de Rette*
