Re: Kunagoro ISHIBASHI

This file reveals a claim against the above in the sum of \$1325.00 to the Provincial Board of Health, which represents hospitalization in Tranquille Hospital of his son, Hideo (deceased), from June 25th, 1935 to September 8th, 1936. On July 25th, 1944 we heard from the Local Supervisor of the Japanese Division of the Department of Labour to the effect that Mr. ISHIBASHI was unable to pay anything on this claim at that time. They also gave us the information that he was an Old Age Pensioner and was 74 years old. We wrote to Mr. J. G. McKee, Collector of Institutional Revenue, on August 14th, 1944, and gave him this information and also gave him the address of the debtor, so the settlement of this claim now rests with him.

RE: Kumagoro ISHIBASHI

This man declared no chattels when he registered with this office on the 4th of April, 1942.

However on April 12th, 1943, he inquired if fishing nets stored at the house of Mr. Stan Leslie had been sold. Investigation showed that Mr. Leslie bought one net for \$50.00, which amount was credited to the account of the above. No other nets were discovered.

On April 28th, 1943, he applied for shipment to him at Slocan City of a trunk containing clothing, bedding, etc., and on July 5th he applied for shipment of 4 wooden boxes containing kitchen utensils. All of the above were left in the care of Mr. Stan Leslie and were subsequently shipped to Mr. Ishibashi. On March 14th, 1944, Mr. ISHIBASHI requested us to pay the B.C. Security Commission the sum of \$7.50, being the amount of the freight and cartage charges on the goods shipped and to debit his account with this sum. We advised the B.C. Security Commission that this could not be done as there was a large claim against Mr. ISHIBASHI from the Provincial Board of Health. (See Claims Summary).

We are sending Mr. ISHIBASHI a cheque for \$50.00, his entire credit balance with us, and this file may now be closed.

Dear Sir:

From time to time you have been advised in regard to the administration of your affairs, and ~~these~~ now being completed, it is felt that you would appreciate being supplied with a brief summary.

When you registered with the Custodian, April 4th, 1942, you declared no property whatsoever in the protected area. However we subsequently received an inquiry from you regarding a net which was left in care of Mr. Stan Leslie. This was sold for \$50.00 and the proceeds credited to your account with the Custodian, and we now enclose our cheque in this amount, being your entire credit balance on our books. We also received two Custodian Releases from you, one for shipment of a trunk and one for four boxes of kitchen utensils. These articles were forwarded to you by the Japanese Division of the Department of Labour. You requested us to pay them the sum of \$7.50, the amount of the shipping and cartage charges on these goods. We advised them that this could not be done on account of a large claim registered against you by the Provincial Board of Health, which is stated to represent hospitalization in Tranquille Hospital for your son, Hideo Ishibashi (deceased), from June 25th, 1935 to September 8th, 1936. On July 25th, 1944, we heard from the Local Supervisor of the Japanese Division of the Department of Labour to the effect that you were unable to pay anything on this account at that time and this information we passed on to Mr. J. G. McRae, Collector of Institutional Revenue, and the matter now rests with him.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
