IN THE MATTER OF a receipt for radio

owned by Tadashi KONDO, Japanese

Of Hamilton, Ontario.

I, Tadashi KONDO, of Hamilton, Ontario, do solemnly declare:

1. That I owned a home-made radio without cabinet, speaker separate, and have personal knowledge of the facts herein declared.
2. That I had in my possession and control at 121 Heatley Avenue, Vancouver, British Columbia a home-made radio without cabinet, speaker separate.
3. On the Thirteenth day of March, 1942, Masuya KONDO, acting in my behalf, delivered the said radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.
4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt in all repositories where such receipt might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipt has been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.
5. That I have not in any way dealt with the said receipt or papers relating to the said radio and have not pledged or hypothecated the same or lodged the receipt with any person, firm or corporation as security.
6. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.
7. That I have been informed that my radio has been sold for the net sum of \$23.31.
8. That I, Tadashi KONDO, the owner, am therefore now entitled to the proceeds of such sale, amounting to \$23.31.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.

Dear Sir:

In regard to the third paragraph of your letter of October 27, 1947, which deals with two radio receipts and a radio belonging to Mr. Sanjiro Hikida, the statements made in your letter do not agree with the information on file here.

You state that two receipts were taken to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police at Hamilton which they had to send to the Custodian. In regard to this, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police sent to this office a radio receipt for a radio surrendered by Risauro Kawaguchi on behalf of Sanjiro Hikida. The police informed us that you had stated that this receipt had been given to your mother who gave it to you. The police informed this office that you wished to know if you could obtain this radio. The report from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police made no mention of any receipt, other than that for the radio of Sanjiro Hikida.

Upon receiving the receipt for Mr. Hikida's radio from the police, we wrote Mr. Hikida informing him that the receipt for the radio surrendered on his behalf had been turned in to the police by you. We informed him that you had stated that the receipt had been given to your mother, who had given the receipt to you, and that you had asked if the radio could be sent to you. We asked Mr. Hikida if he had sold or given the radio to your mother.

On July 27, 1945, we received a reply from Mr. Hikida stating that he had not given or sold the radio to your mother, and stating that he was the legal owner of the radio. He asked that the funds from the sale of the radio be sent to him.

On August 9, 1945, we wrote to you and to your mother, Mrs. Sute Kondo, informing you of the statement made by Mr. Hikida in regard to this radio. We asked for an explanation of why the receipt had been given to your mother. We asked if it had been given as security for a debt or if it had been given to your mother. We sent you each a stamped, addressed envelope and asked you to reply promptly. Your letter, of October 27th, is the first letter received from either you or your mother since that time.

You state that the receipt for Mr. Hikida's radio was in your name. The receipt we received from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, at Hamilton, Ontario, did not carry your name.

You state that this office was confused because Mr. Hikida was complaining

about his radio. Our records show no complaints from Mr. Hikida, and our letter to you, of August 9, 1945, did not mention any complaints from Mr. Hikida. We did inform you that Mr. Hikida had said,

"Please be notified that the radio was not given or sold to Mrs. Sute Kondo, and that I am still the legal owner of it."

You state that Mr. Hikida's radio was in your name and that your mother has told you that cartage of \$5.00 was paid, and that you wrote us that Mr. Hikida had not paid the cartage expense. In regard to this, as we have already stated, the receipt for the radio belonging to Mr. Hikida showed that the radio had been turned over to the police by Mr. Hisaburo Kawaguchi on behalf of Mr. Sanjiro Hikida. There is nothing on the receipt to show that you had any connection with this matter at all. In regard to the cartage expense of \$5.00, your letter of October 27th was the first intimation this office received that you had any claim against Mr. Hikida. If Mr. Hikida was indebted to you, you should have notified the Custodian on April 1, 1942, when you reported to the Custodian regarding your property. Another opportunity was given to you to report this claim at the time you signed a statement of your assets and liabilities, during the period of your internment. At neither time, however, did you mention that Mr. Hikida was indebted to you. In fact you stated that you had no debtors.

As you are aware, Mr. Hikida has been repatriated to Japan. There are no funds in his account with the Custodian. No action will be taken by this office in regard to your reported claim against Mr. Hikida.

Dear Sir:

Your letter of October 27, 1947, has been received. We note your inquiry regarding a radio, which you state was your property.

According to our records a home-made radio, which was reported to have been surrendered by Mr. Masuya Kondo, on behalf of Tadashi Kondo, was turned over to the Custodian by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. This radio was sold for the net sum of \$23.31. These funds were credited to your account as we were under the impression that you were the Tadashi Kondo concerned.

However, we wrote you on August 13, 1945, informing you of the sale of this radio and asking you to send us the receipt given at the time the radio was surrendered in order that we might remit to you the funds received from the sale. We sent you a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying, but no reply was received from you.

On February 11, 1947, we again wrote to you asking you to send us the receipt in order that we might send you the funds. Again we sent you an addressed envelope for your reply. Again we received no reply from you.

On May 7, 1947, we wrote you about this radio. With our letter we enclosed a form to be filled out by you, in the event that the radio was your property but the receipt was missing. We informed you that if we did not hear from you by May 31, 1947, we would assume that the radio equipment concerned was not your property. No reply was received to our letter. The funds from the sale of the radio were therefore removed from your account, as it seemed clear that you had no interest in the radio or in the funds received from its sale.

We do not understand what further information you may want about the radio, since complete details in regard to this matter have been sent to you repeatedly, without receiving the courtesy of a reply. If it should be that you were the owner of the radio turned over to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police by Mr. Masuya Kondo, and are willing to sign a Statutory Declaration stating that the radio was your property, consideration will be given to your Declaration in regard to the sum of \$23.31 now held in Custodian account.

For your convenience, we enclose a Statutory Declaration form. It will be necessary for your signature to be placed on the Declaration in the presence of a Notary or Commissioner for Taking Affidavits, who will sign as witness.

If you could kindly look in your files for my radio which it has been sold by R.C.M.P. The radio were home made five tubes mantel set with separate loud speaker were packed in paper box.

I had a letter from your office send to me two years ago when I were living at 153 Wellington St., North. I had a receipt in my hand for a person name Mr. Hikida at Kelowna at that time but I believe he went ~~XX~~ back to Japan one year ago. The two receipts were taken to R.C.M.P. at Hamilton which they had been send to custodian and it were never send back to me. I had a letter from custodian for Mr. Hikida purpose for his radio receipt were made in my name that you were very confused because Mr. Hikida were complaining about his radio, his radio were in my name but my mom have told me that cartage were paid \$5.00. I have wrote to you that Mr. Hikida havn't paid the cartage expence. I don't know whether you have forward a cheque to Mr. Hikida for his radio sale which I like to know very badly how my radio sale is coming. I heard it has been sold by custodian, I haven't hear from your office for sometime.

I will be very appreciated if you could kindly let me know soon as possible. I will be waiting for your reply.
