
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Shizu (Mrs. Denkichi) SUZUKI, Reg. No. 11044

In her declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942, this woman declared a quantity of foodstuffs, clothing, kitchen utensils and carpenter's tools at Inverness Cannery, Skeena River, B.C.

On May 19, 1942, Mr. George Rorie, Custodian agent at Prince Rupert, reported that 16 items of personal effects had been shipped to the husband of this woman through the B. C. Security Commission. On May 19, 1942, a Custodian release signed "D" SUZUKI, but giving the registration number of Mrs. SUZUKI, was sent to this office. This release covered 45 items and while this release appears to cover some of the same articles which Mr. Rorie reported had been shipped, it included a number of others not previously reported and it would appear that all household and personal effects reported by this woman had been shipped to her.

She also reported 4 fishing nets, 3 pumps and sundry tools. The file of her husband, file 209, reveals that on August 29, 1942, we received from J. H. Todd & Sons a cheque for \$124.50 in payment of 3 jacks, 1 peavy, 1 crow-bar, 2 fishing nets and 17 lbs. of new web. Mrs. SUZUKI also reported some East-Hope engine parts and an old automobile engine. It is noted that the husband of this woman sold to J. H. Todd & Sons a fishing vessel equipped with an East-Hope 7-h.p. engine. The agreement of sale stated that the boat was to be in running order and all equipment was included. It may be assumed that any articles of any value left by Mr. & Mrs. SUZUKI at Inverness Cannery that have not been shipped or sold to J. H. Todd & Sons, were part of the equipment of the fishing vessel.

Mrs. SUZUKI declared \$10.00 in War Saving Certificates in her own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Dear Sir:

Enclosed herewith is Custodian cheque for the sum of \$50.25, representing all the funds standing to your credit with this office. These funds were paid in to this office in full settlement of the claim which you had lodged with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred in connection with the impounding of your fishing vessel.

In your declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942, you stated that you owned no property of any kind left in the protected area. However, on July 11, 1942, this office handed to you cheque for \$43.50 which had been received from J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd. in payment of wood which they had purchased from you. On August 29, 1942, we received J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd. cheque for \$124.50 in payment of fishing gear and tools purchased from you by that company. These funds have since been remitted to you.

According to the records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, the vessel "D.S." was sold by you through the Committee for the net sum of \$467.75 which was paid to you on April 7, 1942.

We note that your wife reported a quantity of personal effects, as well as the fishing gear and tools purchased by J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd. in August, 1942. These were reported as being at Inverness Cannery. All chattels of any value left at Inverness Cannery have been shipped.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
