PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

November 3, 1947

Re: Kaichi TABATA - Reg. No. 09748

This man was employed as a mill worker by the B. C. Pulp and Paper Co., Port Alice, B. C. He signed a declaration to the Custodian March 21, 1942, and was evacuated on March 23, 1942.

Kaichi TABATA and his wife declared the chattels listed in the Chattel Schedule. These were left in the care of the B. C. Police at Port Alice. From Port Alice, on March 24/42 a shipment was made to TABATA at Vancouver. It is possible that there were other shipments made to him or to his wife, but neither the Department of Labour shipping records, now in this office, nor Custodian records show further shipments. However, it would appear from the letter of May 22/42, from the B. C. Police, Port Alice, that nothing belonging to TABATA or Mrs. TABATA remained in the hall at Port Alice on that date. No inquiries have been received from this couple since their evacuation, so it would seem that their chattels have been shipped to them or disposed of by themselves.

TABATA reported an in-board engine and an out-board engine taken by the Navy. One of these engines was placed on his boat at the time of its sale, the other was sold through this office and the net proceeds in the amount of \$24.94 was credited to his account. This amount was remitted to him July 6/46.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that a 14-foot vessel was sold and the net proceeds paid to K. TABATA on Nov. 10/42, the engine for which vessel was in custody and delivered to the purchaser. TABATA declared that his 14-foot row boat had been sold.

TABATA reported \$200.00 in Victory Bonds, \$112.00 in War Savings Certificates and a \$3,000.00 life insurance policy with the Sun Life Assurance Co., all in his own possession. These items were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$9.96 received as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941. This amount was remitted to TABATA Oct. 8/42.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

(It is possible that these items were included in the articles shipped to Mr. TABATA - as shown above)

Mrs. TABATA declared April 11/42:

Carpenter's Tools - which her husband had forgotten to register and which were with her luggage at Hastings Park at that date.

It is possible that there were other shipments made to TABATA or to Mrs. TABATA other than the one listed above, but neither the Department of Labour shipping records, now in this office, nor Custodian records show further shipments. However, it would appear from the letter of May 22/42, from the B. C. Police, Port Alice, that nothing belonging to TABATA or Mrs. TABATA remained in the hall at Port Alice on that date. No inquiries have been received from this couple since their evacuation, so it would seem that their chattels have been shipped to them or disposed of by themselves.
